Message from Pastor





Stewardship



Each one of us, young and old alike, is personally called today by the Holy Spirit into the same mission as that of the first Apostles — to advance the Kingdom of God in our corner of the world. Just as He did on that Pentecost day, the Holy Spirit speaks to us in our “own language” to give us the Good News of the Gospel and urge us to share it. We can think of our own language as the particular gifts, talents and passions we possess. We experience the presence of

the Holy Spirit through them and we are meant to put them to work in grateful service of the Kingdom of God. When we surrender ourselves to God, putting Him first in all aspects of life — our time, talents, and finances — we can count on a life that is challenging, yes, but even more so a life that is exciting, creative and deeply rewarding. In others words, we can experience life as a great adventure because it is a life guided and directed by the very source of power and creativity— the Holy Spirit.

Culture of Life Corner

For the Church, there is no distinction between defending human life and promoting the dignity of the human person.

Pope Benedict XVI writes in **Caritas in Veritate** . . . that "The Church forcefully maintains this link between life ethics and social ethics, fully aware that 'a society lacks solid foundations when, on the one hand, it asserts values such as the dignity of the person, justice and peace, but then, on the other hand, radically acts to the contrary by allowing or tolerating a variety of ways in which human life is devalued and violated, especially where it is weak or marginalized.'" (no. 15)

As a gift from God, every human life is sacred from conception to natural death. The life and dignity of every person must be respected and protected at every stage and in every condition. The right to life is the first and most fundamental principle of human rights that leads Catholics to actively work for a world of greater respect for human life and greater commitment to justice and peace.

El único Bautismo, unión entre todos los cristianos

El Papa Francisco recordando el lema del Viaje dijo que, había exhortado a “Caminar juntos” y su alegría fue poder hacerlo no desde lejos, ni desde arriba, sino caminando entre el pueblo rumano, como un peregrino en su tierra. “Como cristianos, tenemos la gracia de vivir un tiempo de relaciones fraternas entre las diferentes Iglesias. En Rumania – subrayó el Pontífice – la mayoría de los fieles pertenecen a la Iglesia Ortodoxa, actualmente guiada por el Patriarca Daniel, a quien dirijo mis pensamientos fraternos y agradecidos. La comunidad católica, tanto ‘griega’ como ‘latina’, es viva y activa. La unión entre todos los cristianos, aunque incompleta, se basa en el único Bautismo y está sellada por la sangre y el sufrimiento padecido juntos en los tiempos oscuros de las persecuciones, especialmente en el último siglo bajo el régimen ateo”.

La unidad no elimina la diversidad

Asimismo, el Santo Padre resaltó el cordial encuentro sostenido con el Patriarca y el Santo Sínodo de la Iglesia Ortodoxa Rumana, en el cual reafirmó la voluntad de la Iglesia Católica de caminar juntos en una memoria reconciliada y hacia una unidad más plena, que el mismo pueblo rumano invocó proféticamente durante la visita de San Juan Pablo II. “Esta importante dimensión ecuménica del viaje – precisó el Papa – culminó con la solemne Oración del Padre Nuestro dentro de la nueva, imponente catedral Ortodoxa de Bucarest. Fue un momento de gran valor simbólico, porque el Padrenuestro es la oración cristiana por excelencia, herencia común de todos los bautizados. Hemos manifestado que la unidad no elimina las legítimas diversidades. Que el Espíritu Santo nos lleve a vivir cada vez más como hijos de Dios y hermanos entre nosotros”.

Encuentro con la Comunidad Católica

Además, el Papa Francisco señaló que con la Comunidad Católica celebró tres Liturgias Eucarísticas. La primera fue en la Catedral de Bucarest, el 31 de mayo, fiesta de la Visitación de la Virgen María, icono de la Iglesia en camino en la fe y en la caridad. La segunda en el Santuario de Șumuleu Ciuc, destino de muchos peregrinos. Allí, la Santa Madre de Dios reúne a los fieles en la variedad de idiomas, culturas y tradiciones. Y la tercera celebración fue la Divina Liturgia en Blaj, centro de la Iglesia Greco-Católica en Rumania, con la Beatificación de siete obispos mártires greco-católicos, testigos de la libertad y de la misericordia que vienen del Evangelio. Uno de estos nuevos beatos, Mons. Iuliu Hossu, escribió durante su encarcelamiento: "Dios nos ha enviado a esta oscuridad del sufrimiento para dar perdón y orar por la conversión de todos". Pensando en las terribles torturas a las que fueron sometidos, estas palabras son un testimonio de misericordia.
