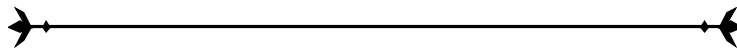

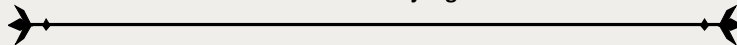

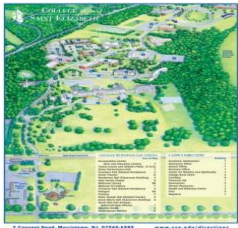

Culture of Life Corner

Ask the Legislature to protect the Religious Employers Exemption!

S3804/A5508 is part of a package of bills that the Governor and the legislature are supporting to create a New Jersey version of the federal Affordable Care and Patient Protection act of 2010.

Unfortunately, the bills would expand insurance coverage for abortion inducing drugs and eliminate the religious employers' exemption contained in New Jersey law.

The bills are on a fast track and soon will be scheduled for a hearing in the Senate Budget and Appropriations Committee and the Assembly Appropriations Committee.

If the religious employers' exemption is eliminated, our Catholic parishes and schools would be forced to provide insurance coverage for abortion inducing drugs.

Please contact your legislators and ask them to amend the Bills to protect the religious employers exemption.

NB: This pilgrimage has been rescheduled for February 9 - 18, 2020

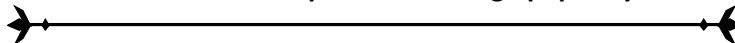

St. Vincent Martyr and The Community Soup Kitchen/Outreach Update (from the CSK Annual Report): It all begins with food . . .

In 2018 the CSK in Morristown served over 77,000 nutritious meals, and distributed over 650,000 pounds of fresh produce through their Free Farmers Markets. Eighty-five percent of their guests suffer from chronic health issues than can be alleviated by healthy diets. Coupled with their Growing Healthy Kids & Summer Lunch programs, they are educating kids on the value of healthy eating as well as working to reduce and eliminate child obesity. But a healthy diet is just the beginning.

With the support the CSK receives, through parishioners such as ourselves, as well as corporate sponsors, and other non-profits and organizations and groups, the CSK is able to offer ongoing medical case management for guests with conditions such as hypertension, HIV, and diabetes. In addition to this, in 2018 the CSK has found employment for 22 guests, bringing the total to 80 people in the last 3 years, finding permanent housing for 67 guests.

We do not want the cost to be a deterrent for anyone who wishes to attend.

The next thing you can wear to church is a smile. That will give others the feeling that you're happy to be there and happy to see them, too. And of course you'll want to don your best singing voice so you can sing with gusto (regardless of ability) and really participate in the Mass.

Perhaps you'll want to accessorize by tucking a small notepad in your purse or pocket. You can use it to jot down prayer requests, intercessions, or thoughts from the homily to review later. That will help you live the Mass all week long.

Finally, as a good rule of thumb for clothing, avoid outfits you wear to the beach, to play a sport, (unless you are a child on the way to or from a sporting event) or to work out at the gym.

Aferrados a María

«Hemos comenzado un nuevo ciclo de catequesis que seguirá el «viaje» del Evangelio que narra el libro de los Hechos de los Apóstoles. Todo tiene origen en la Resurrección de Cristo, que es la fuente de vida nueva. Por eso los discípulos permanecen unidos y perseverantes en la oración, junto a María, la Madre de Jesús y de la nueva comunidad, en espera de recibir el Espíritu Santo».

Uno de los dolorosos acontecimientos de la Pasión que muestra este libro, dijo el Papa, es que los Apóstoles del Señor ya no son los doce elegidos por Él, sino once. Esto sucede porque Judas se quitó la vida aplastado por el remordimiento:

«Esa primera comunidad estaba formada por ciento veinte hermanos y hermanas, un número que contiene el doce, emblemático para Israel, por las doce tribus, y también para la Iglesia, por los doce Apóstoles elegidos por Jesús, que después de los acontecimientos dolorosos de la pasión, con la traición de Judas, se redujeron a once».

El virus del orgullo infectó el corazón del Apóstol

Judas, explicó Francisco, “había empezado a separarse de la comunión con el Señor y con los demás, a hacer a solas, a aislarse, a apegarse al dinero hasta explotar a los pobres, a perder de vista el horizonte de la gratuidad y de la entrega, hasta que permitió que el virus del orgullo infectara su mente y su corazón”:

«Judas, que había recibido la gracia de formar parte del grupo inseparable de Jesús, perdió de vista el horizonte de la gratuidad del don recibido y dejó entrar en su corazón el virus del orgullo; y de amigo se volvió enemigo de Jesús, traicionándolo».

Así, Judas, que había recibido esta gracia «prefirió la muerte a la vida, un camino de oscuridad y ruina. Los otros once, en cambio, escogieron la vida y la bendición, convirtiéndose en responsables de transmitir las de generación en generación, del Pueblo de Israel a la Iglesia».

Se inaugura el discernimiento comunitario

Se hizo necesario entonces “reconstituir el grupo de los doce”, y así “se inaugura la práctica del discernimiento comunitario”, que consiste en ver la realidad a través de los ojos de Dios, desde el punto de vista de la unidad y la comunión:

«El evangelista Lucas nos dice cómo el abandono de Judas causó una herida al cuerpo comunitario. Era necesario que su misión pasara a otro. Pedro indicó el requisito indispensable: haber sido discípulo de Jesús desde el principio hasta el fin, desde el bautismo en el Jordán hasta la Ascensión».

He aquí que la comunidad ora de la siguiente manera – siguió diciendo Francisco: «Tú, Señor, que conoces el corazón de todos, muestra cuál de estos dos has elegido para ocupar el lugar que Judas ha abandonado». Y el Señor indica a Matías:

«De los dos candidatos propuestos, el escogido fue Matías, que es asociado a los once, reconstituyendo el colegio apostólico, signo de que la comunión es el primer testimonio de una comunidad viva y que sigue el estilo del Señor».

La comunión supera las divisiones

De esta manera - prosiguió el Santo Padre - se reconstituye el cuerpo de los Doce, signo de comunión, y esa comunión supera las divisiones, el aislamiento, la mentalidad que absolutiza el espacio privado, signo de que la comunión es el primer testimonio que ofrecen los Apóstoles.

Redescubrir la belleza de dar testimonio del Resucitado

El Romano Pontífice señaló entonces también *nuestranecesidad* de “redescubrir la belleza de dar testimonio del Resucitado”, “dejando atrás las actitudes autorreferenciales, renunciando a retener los dones de Dios y no cediendo a la mediocridad”. Puesto que la reconstitución del colegio apostólico “muestra cómo en el ADN de la comunidad cristiana hay unidad y libertad de sí mismo, que nos permite no temer la diversidad, no apegarnos a las cosas y a los dones y ser mártires, es decir, testigos luminosos del Dios vivo y operante en la historia” (Tomado Audiencia Papa 06/12/19)

Los Sacramentos
