**CROSSING THE THRESHOLD**

This weekend our parish crosses the threshold between our experience of being locked down for over thirteen weeks and what we are calling phase one of our re-entry into sacred space. I have been thinking about this moment and how I believe we need to make that crossing. Here is what I have come up with.

First and foremost we need to make this crossing with gratitude. God has done so much for us during our time of sheltering in. Not only has God gotten us through some very trying times, but God has also brought good out of this adversity. We have seen that goodness in the bravery of front liners, the outreach of so many individuals and groups, the closer bonding of families and friends and the deeper rootedness in faith that many of us have experienced. These are just a few of the ways God has acted on our behalf in our need. I invite you to name your own thankfulness as we come into this weekend. The second thing that we need to do in this time of crossing is to reflect on what we have learned about ourselves and our world and how we can hold on to those lessons moving into the future. I have heard from so many people that this time of slowing down has made them aware of how important it is for families to spend time with one another, something we can miss when life is busy with running from one event to another. I believe that this slowing down has also made us more aware of the struggles of others, such as the need to continue to work for equality among the races and justice for all in our society. We have learned also about the value of technology in keeping us connected as families, friends and in our case, as a church community. We have also seen how that same technology can be a tool that we can use to invite others into our experience as church. From others I have heard about a new found appreciation for nature and creation, finding hope in something as simple as the bird song in the early hours of the day or a walk in the cool of the evening. What have you learned in this time of social distancing but spiritual closeness? Perhaps you want to name that lesson and commit to some way of integrating it into your life.

Finally, we need to make this crossing mindful that as the parish family of Saint Vincent Martyr we are one in the Spirit and one in the Lord. This time of transition is about who we are as a community of faith, called now to build an experience of church that will embrace both those making a physical return to our sacred space and those who will worship in that wider sacred space that reaches out to all the corners of our parish. I invite you to keep connected, to reach out to your fellow parishioners and to truly live as the one Body of Christ that we are called to be – truly a worthy thought on the beautiful solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ.

My friends let us hold one another in prayer that we continue to stay strong in Christ. And let us pray that the power of Christ flow through us to heal our nation, drawing us more fully into His Kingdom where every life matters, where every voice is heard and every human being is seen for who they are, beloved sons and daughters of God. God bless us all.

## Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas,

Los siguientes son los pasos a seguir para la re-apertura de nuestra parroquia para la celebración en español.

Si desea colaborar con el equipo de la reapertura de la Iglesia, por favor, enviar un correo con sus datos al Padre Jader.

A continuación los pasos que debemos seguir.

### Paso 1: Decide si Debes Venir a Misa

El Obispo Serratelli ha dispensado a los fieles de la Diócesis de Paterson de la obligación de asistir a la misa del Domingo y las Misas de los días Santos hasta nuevo aviso. Queremos enfatizar que cualquiera que esté en mayor riesgo de complicaciones por COVID-19, que esté enfermo de alguna manera o que simplemente no se sienta seguro de estar en público no está obligado a asistir a Misa. También debemos enfatizar, que cualquiera en esas categorías siempre está exento de la obligación de asistir a Misa, incluso cuando el Obispo no haya hecho una declaración formal.

Además, le pedimos que si tiene algún síntoma que incluye tos, fiebre y / o fatiga por cualquier motivo (incluso si está seguro de que son alergias), que se quede en casa. Apreciamos el gran anhelo de volver a asistir a Misa, y entendemos que muchos de ustedes con síntomas leves se sentirán "lo suficientemente bien", pero, por caridad para otros miembros de nuestra familia parroquial, no vengán hasta que estén completamente sanos.

Continuaremos transmitiendo Misa en vivo incluso después de que se hayan reanudado las Misas públicas.

### Paso 2: Antes de Venir a Misa

1. Regístrese para la Misa de fin de semana a la que su familia quisiera asistir. Necesitamos limitar nuestra asistencia de una manera que permita el distanciamiento social. Usaremos el sitio 'Sign-Up Genius' para ayudarnos a llevar la cuenta. Puede registrarse aquí. Se requieren inscripciones para la Misa diaria, siguiendo los mismos procedimientos que se aplican a las Misas de fin de semana.

2. Asegúrese de que todos los miembros de su familia tengan una máscara para usar durante la misa. Lleve consigo un desinfectante para manos a la Misa para que pueda lavarse las manos antes y después de la comunión. No traiga ningún producto de blanqueador, ya que pueden dañar los bancos. Todas las personas mayores de 2 años deben usar mascarillas.

3. Use el baño en casa. Los baños solo se pueden usar en caso de emergencia. Se proporcionarán suministros para limpiar después de su uso

### Paso 3: Cuando Llegas

1. Póngase la máscara antes de entrar al edificio de la iglesia.  
2. Observe todas las directivas de los hospedadores en el estacionamiento y en las veredas.  
3. Presente la confirmación de su reserva a estos hospedadores en el estacionamiento y proceda a ponerse en línea para ingresar.  
4. Ingrese solo por las puertas principales adelante de la calle 'Green Village Road'. Esta puerta de la iglesia se mantendrá abierta para que no tenga que tocarla.

5. Desinfecta tus manos antes de entrar al edificio de la iglesia. Tendremos estaciones de desinfectante de manos cerca de la entrada del edificio, pero solicite que traiga su propio desinfectante de manos si puede.

6. Hemos revisado el diseño de la Iglesia para proporcionar el distanciamiento adecuado entre los grupos de familias. Un hospedador lo acompañará a su asiento. No le será posible seleccionar su asiento. El diseño está configurado para acomodar el número máximo de feligreses.

7. Hemos eliminado todos los libros y productos de papel de las bancas, pero lo alentamos a que siga las lecturas y las partes de la misa en su teléfono. También puede encontrar las lecturas en nuestro sitio [www.svmnj.org](http://www.svmnj.org)

### Paso 4: Durante la Misa

1. No habrá coros y el canto se desaconseja en general. Cantar requiere voces proyectadas, lo que aumenta el riesgo de propagación viral.

2. No compartiremos el Signo de la Paz entre nosotros. Tenga cuidado de no tocar a nadie fuera de su familia.

3. No habrá procesiones ofertivas. No vamos a pasar canastas para una colección de ofertorio. Colocaremos canastas cerca de las salidas de la iglesia en las que puede colocar su sobre después de la misa. Sin embargo, lo alentamos a que aproveche las donaciones en línea, 'Faith Direct' o por 'Text-to-Give'.

### Paso 5: Recepción de la Sagrada Comunión

La distancia social debe mantenerse a medida que se acerca a la comunión. Siga las instrucciones de los ministros en cuanto al procedimiento para acercarse al Sacerdote.
