I wonder how my dad would have navigated through these days. I am pretty sure that regarding the pandemic and its keeping him off the golf course he would have used his characteristic phrase: This stinks! And as far as the protests and civil unrest we have been seeing following the killing of George Floyd I know he would have had some very strong opinions, not all of which would have aligned with mine. Above all – and this I know as well as my own name which is the junior version of his - my dad would have been digging deep into his faith, putting his hope in the Lord and doing the next loving thing. I could see him now, reading from his Magnificat, joining me for virtual Mass with Nina my stepmom, saying his daily prayer to Saint Joseph for a happy death (a grace that was mercifully granted to him) and asking me about when we were going to get back into church so he could daily receive communion again. I also think that my dad would have shed some tears – tears for those struggling with the virus and tears for those struggling with injustice. You see, a beautiful thing happened in my dad in his later years – his heart became softer and his spirit more vulnerable with age. He seemed to feel more and more deeply as time went on. I would like to say that he more completely took on the heart of Christ.

It seems to me that as I am getting older I am becoming my dad. I am mellowing somewhat – okay, just a bit. I like that! I hope he does too. I want him to know what an incredible difference he has made in my life. I imagine that you wonder about that as a dad. I know I do as a different kind of father. Are your efforts at mentoring having any impact? Are the lessons you are trying to teach sinking in at all? Is the wisdom that you are trying to impart really being received? In the end it comes down to doing your best and letting God do the rest – and be assured that he does not waste any of our efforts!

The other thing that I find I must do as a father is to be committed to growing in Christ. For me that means learning what it means to make life less about myself and more about God. It means learning how to let go of what does not serve my calling and striving to be the best – and wisest – version of myself. It means understanding that I am just one part of a bigger reality and humbly taking my place in that cosmic picture. It means letting the Holy Spirit take the lead in my life and following the Spirit’s prompts. It means being perfected by grace in the hands of my heavenly Father.

To all our men in the parish who have accepted the mantle of fathering in any way I wish a very Happy Father’s Day! God bless you and keep you in the way of His love.

Last weekend’s Masses were a bit like gathering as a family for a big holiday meal – loads of preparation, great happiness at seeing those who could come and missing those who were not able to be there. I want to thank everyone who are assisting the parish in this current phase of reentry into our church, both virtually and on site. It is clear that we are ONE IN THE SPIRIT here at the parish, with everyone stepping up wherever and however they can. We are committed to making the return to church both safe and comfortable while maintaining a 100% virtual presence for our parishioners participating from home. May God continue to bless our efforts!

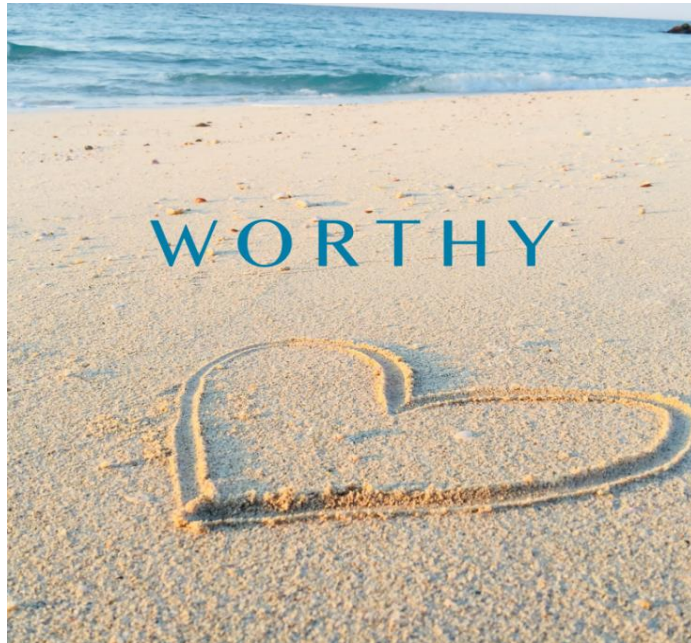

We witness first-hand the organization, preparation, and basic human kindness that goes into feeding lunch to 200+ people. This was an experience that created a lasting impression.

The impact of Covid has negatively affected many and interrupted the daily life of all. Yet at Eva's Soup Kitchen, they continue to feed those in need. In March, Eva's Kitchen temporarily switched from gathering daily to share meals to a "meals-to-go program" in order to abide by health and safety guidelines.

St. Vincent Martyr Parish and St. Vincent Martyr Youth Ministry has long partnered with Eva's Village to help serve and feed a community of working poor and homeless individuals and families. 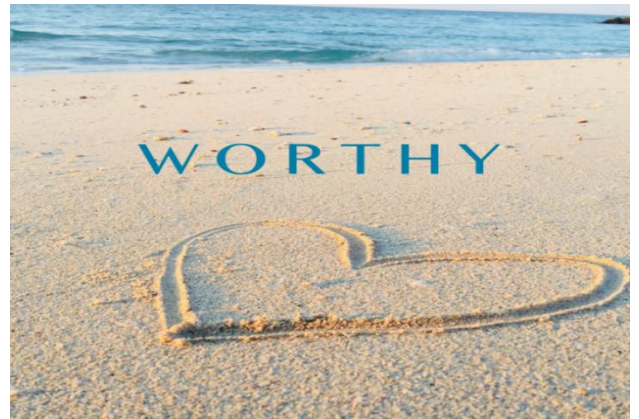

Mientras que Europa comienza a planificar la fase de las post-pandemia, en América Latina la situación del coronavirus continúa agravándose y la curva de contagios de muchos países todavía no ha alcanzado su punto de inflexión.

Al COVID-19 se suman otros factores como la pobreza, la corrupción, la inestabilidad política y la precariedad de los sistemas sanitarios, que hacen que la vida de los pueblos en esta parte del mundo se convierta en una auténtica lucha diaria por la supervivencia que lleva a millones de personas a preguntarse ¿qué hacer ante este panorama?... ¿morir de hambre, o morir por contagio del virus?

PERÚ. Monseñor Cabrejos: “La salud pública está en niveles inhumanos”

El presidente del Consejo Episcopal Latinoamericano, Monseñor Cabrejos, expresa durante una entrevista con la Agencia SIR, su gran preocupación tanto por la situación de salud como por las consecuencias sociales que provoca el coronavirus en el continente, además de mostrar inquietud por la forma en que algunos gobiernos están manejando la pandemia.

“El COVID-19 se ha trasladado hasta América Latina, convirtiéndose este continente en el epicentro de los contagios, donde las perspectivas no son buenas y las cifras oficiales no parecen reflejar la gravedad de la situación”

Además, el prelado asegura que esta emergencia sanitaria hace tambalear a la economía de muchos países en América Latina, que ya sufrían inestabilidad antes de la llegada del virus.

“El Fondo Monetario Internacional dijo que América Latina es el área de menor crecimiento en el mundo, y CEPAL (la Comisión de las Naciones Unidas para América Latina y el Caribe) ha denunciado que los últimos 5 años han sido los peores desde 1970. Conocemos la crisis política y social de varios países, Venezuela sobre todo, pero también la situación de la deuda argentina. Estas son crisis estructurales, tratadas hasta ahora con políticas a corto plazo. El empeoramiento del problema económico corre el riesgo de crear tensiones sociales, después de las del otoño pasado”

17 de junio - Reflexionando sobre la dimensión ética en la crisis sanitaria

El Covid-19 tomó por sorpresa a toda la humanidad. De igual manera han sido impresionantes las medidas que se han tomado en muchos países para combatir el mal: la implementación de normas jurídicas de carácter coercitivo hacia la población, así como la declaración de estados de excepción para facilitar los controles sanitarios que buscan evitar la propagación de los contagios.

Queda por preguntarnos: ¿estas medidas garantizan la integridad de todas las personas?

Compartimos **esta reflexión del padre Manuel Cubías**, quien explica que acercarse desde la ética a la actual situación de crisis sanitaria que vive el mundo, tiene un presupuesto necesario: el hecho de querer pensar, comprender, escucharnos y dialogar para conseguir lo mejor y que beneficie a todos; o al menos, a los más vulnerables y empobrecidos, que son la mayoría.
