This has been quite the week for our parish and our diocese. It began last Sunday afternoon when we finally were able to celebrate the Easter Sacraments with Lochlan, Berly and Eugene who were baptized into the Roman Catholic Faith and Karly who was received into the Church. As we made ready to process into the church with our elect and candidate I felt a wave of emotion flood over me, anticipating the joyful liturgy we would share with our sisters and brother. It was a beautiful experience, one that all of us will never forget, including those who joined us virtually on that special day. I am grateful to Jan Figenshu and our RCIA team for their ministry to our newly baptized and confirmed members of our faith community. I am sure they would agree that the celebration was worth waiting for.

This past Tuesday evening Fr. Chris and I were privileged to share in the celebration of Evening Prayer, also called Vespers, welcoming our new bishop to the diocese. Bishop Serratelli, who presided over the celebration and preached the homily, received a well-deserved thunderous applause that night acknowledging his many years of service to the Diocese of Paterson. The celebration included the blessing of the mitre, crosier and episcopal ring that Bishop Elect Sweeney would receive the next day. Because I serve on the Presbyteral Council and the College of Consultors I also had the opportunity to be present at Bishop Sweeney's Episcopal Ordination and his installation as the eighth Bishop of Paterson. The first thing that impressed me on that day was Bishop Sweeney's genuine smile as he showed his letter of appointment from Pope Francis to the assembly. It reminded me a bit like a child showing a really good report card to his parents! That smile was present throughout the entire celebration. It is evident to me that our new bishop is a humble man who delights in being with the people who he is called to serve. There were times in the liturgy that he appeared to be rather overwhelmed by it all, which to me is a good sign that he probably had no aspirations to this new office bestowed upon him. When he moved to the altar to lead us in the Liturgy of the Eucharist he prayed the Mass prayers with great enthusiasm and devotion, putting his heart and soul into presiding at the table. I can't wait for the first time he will preside at our altar here at Saint Vincent Martyr, whenever that might be. Bishop Sweeney's closing remarks at the end of the celebration began with two Scriptural quotes – one from St. Paul to the Corinthians, the other from the first letter of St. John. Both passages spoke of love and were used by our new bishop to set the tone for his ministry as our shepherd. I believe that Bishop Sweeney will lead from the heart, affirming the worth and dignity of every human being as a child of God and showing compassion to all who he will serve. I felt a great and powerful movement of the Holy Spirit in the Cathedral this past Wednesday – I am excited about where that Spirit will move our diocese under the pastoral care of our Bishop Kevin. We pray for him and for us, the Church of Paterson.

The week ends of course with the celebration of Independence Day, the Fourth of July. The festivities this year will be for the most part rather low key so as to continue our nation's attempts to keep the Pandemic in check. This different kind of Fourth gives us an opportunity to look inward and find a healthy pride in being an American. We have much to be proud about in our country, not least of which is how in the face of the pandemic so many people stepped forward to help their fellow Americans. A healthy pride also allows for the humility to recognize where we need to grow more fully into the best version of ourselves as a nation. It allows us to sing about America the beautiful while at the same time asking God to mend our every flaw, including those attitudes and mindsets that blind us to the truth that we are all created equal and worthy of respect. We build up this nation not from a place of negativity but from what is good and graced, striving to be crowned with brotherhood and sisterhood, as beloved community, from sea to shining sea. Have a Happy Fourth of July my friends. May God bless America.

CONGRATULATIONS TO OUR NEWEST CATHOLICS

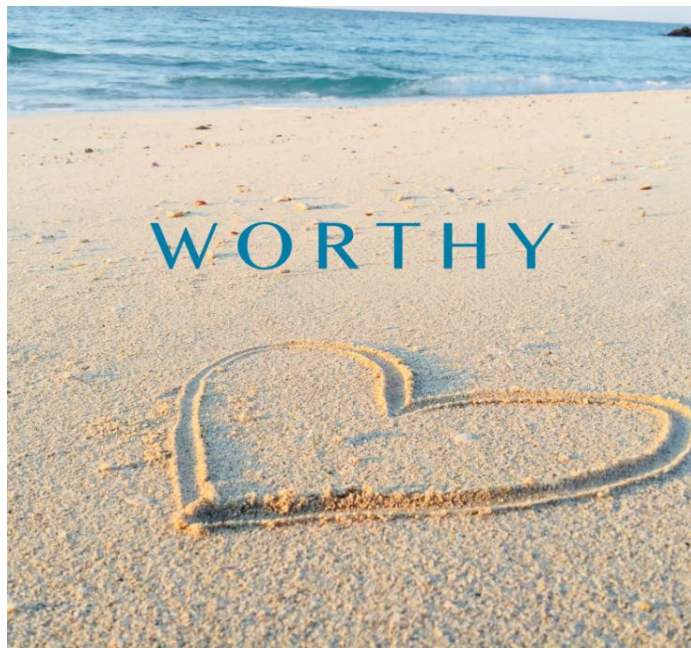

Challenge for the Week:

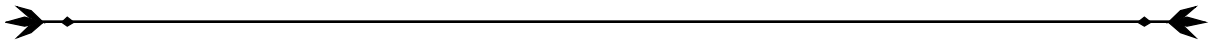
In a spirit of humility, let's pray this Prayer for Humility.

FINANCIAL HELP NEEDED AT EVA'S KITCHEN

My name is Peter Roelke. I am a rising high school junior and a member of St. Vincent's parish since I was in Kindergarten and attended SVMS. This past fall, as part of my SVM youth ministry commitment, many of my fellow classmates and I went to Paterson to volunteer at Eva's Soup Kitchen. We witness first-hand the organization, preparation, and basic human kindness that goes into feeding lunch to 200+ people. This was an experience that created a lasting impression.

The impact of Covid has negatively affected many and interrupted the daily life of all. Yet at Eva's Soup Kitchen, they continue to feed those in need. In March, Eva's Kitchen temporarily switched from gathering daily to share meals to a "meals-to-go program" in order to abide by health and safety guidelines.

St. Vincent Martyr Parish and St. Vincent Martyr Youth Ministry has long partnered with Eva's Village to help serve and feed a community of working poor and homeless individuals and families. 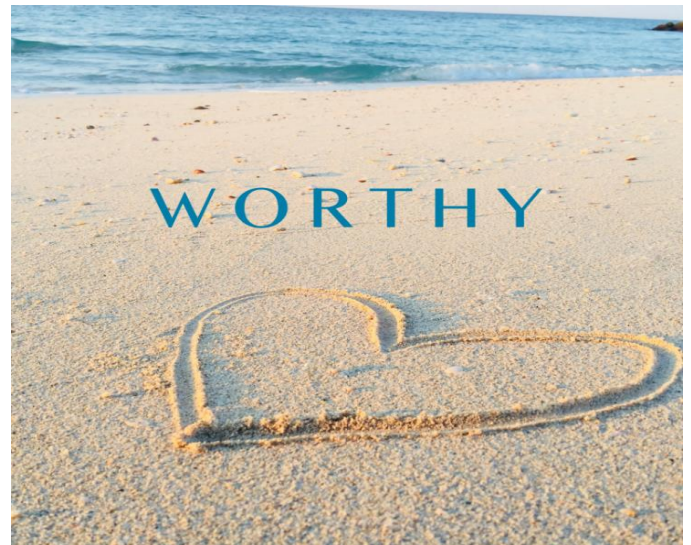
