It is now over a month since we reopened our church building for public worship. A lot of folks have been asking me how it has been going. My response is that it has been going extraordinarily well. Of course, that does not surprise me because we have an extraordinary parish! It is so good to be offering once again a full Mass schedule and other Sacramental celebrations. We are back in full swing with weddings and baptisms, we are working on a schedule for First Communions and we are thankfully able now to give to our beloved deceased a Funeral Mass, bringing much comfort to their families and friends.

One of the ways I describe moving through these days both as a parish and as an individual is that we are riding the wave – which is an appropriate image for summertime! We need to take it one day at a time, responding to whatever challenge comes along in the moment. It is clear that the ‘old normal’ will be no more and a ‘new normal’ is yet to be shaped and formed. So basically we are in the days of ‘no normal’, which of course can be fairly daunting at times. Thank God we have the rock solid foundation of our faith to keep us steady as we go. We have to keep our eye on the Lord and go with the flow of His love in our lives.

With regard to liturgies we have been able to accommodate all of our parishioners who want to attend Mass in our church building, using the schedule of masses currently in effect. We do have the lower church located in the school gym ready to go if the numbers of folks who are coming to Mass increases. We would also be ready to add additional Masses if needed. This is what the numbers looked like in June – the first weekend we were open we had 171 attendees with 3,351 virtual views; the second weekend saw 187 attendees with 2,628 virtual views; the third weekend had 181 attendees with 2,854 virtual views. Our 8:30 weekday Mass had an average of 29 attendees the first week (705 virtual views), an average of 29 attendees the second week (575 virtual views) and an average of 35 attendees the third week (571 virtual views). I’ll give you the July numbers at the end of the month.

It is clear that we are continuing to serve a substantial virtual community, something that we are committed to maintaining moving forward. I believe that we have been successful in uniting the virtual and physical aspects of our parish family – we are definitely one in the Spirit! We are also so very blessed by all of our parishioners who have stepped forward to help our community to worship in a safe, clean and secure environment. In addition to our reopening task force we have over 25 volunteers/disciples serving as meeters, 7 as technicians and 53 as greeters and seaters. We also have had a good number of our Readers step forward to proclaim the Word. All of these good folks are supported by our virtual volunteers/disciples supporting the effort in prayer. Yes, we are blessed!

I thank all of you for your patience and understanding as we have moved through this pandemic. We have been striving to do our very best to serve you and to meet your spiritual and pastoral needs while working with both state and church mandates and guidelines. If you have any questions or concerns about our parish responses to the pandemic do not hesitate to let me know. God bless!

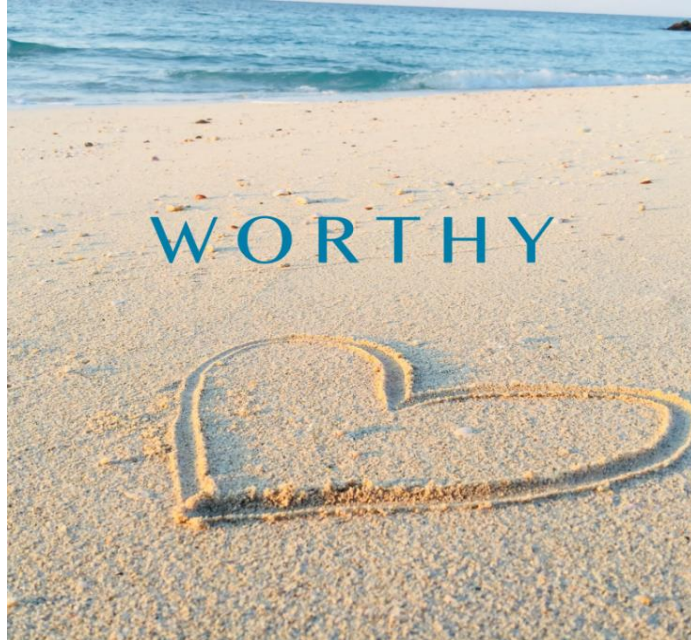

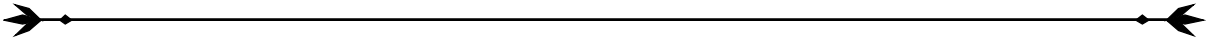

We witness first-hand the organization, preparation, and basic human kindness that goes into feeding lunch to 200+ people. This was an experience that created a lasting impression.

The impact of Covid has negatively affected many and interrupted the daily life of all. Yet at Eva's Soup Kitchen, they continue to feed those in need. In March, Eva's Kitchen temporarily switched from gathering daily to share meals to a "meals-to-go program" in order to abide by health and safety guidelines.

St. Vincent Martyr Parish and St. Vincent Martyr Youth Ministry has long partnered with Eva's Village to help serve and feed a community of working poor and homeless individuals and families. 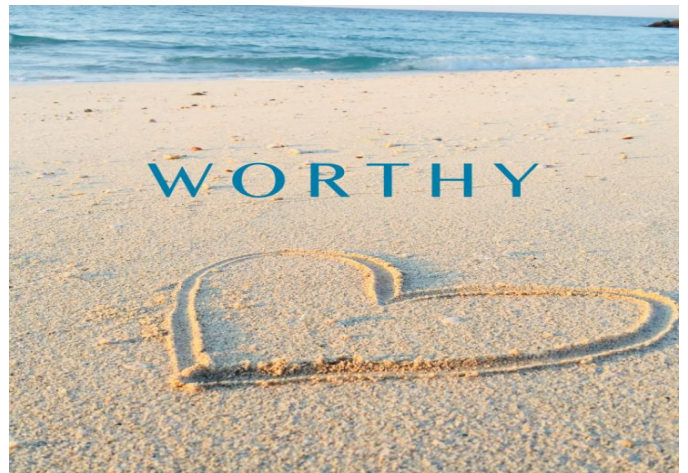

Monseñor José Trinidad Fernández, Obispo Auxiliar de Caracas y Secretario General de la Conferencia Episcopal Venezolana (CEV), dio a conocer a través de una plataforma digital, la Exhortación Pastoral de la CXIV Asamblea Ordinaria Plenaria del Episcopado Venezolano. Vatican News

Monseñor José Trinidad Fernández dio lectura, el pasado 10 de julio, a la [Exhortación Pastoral](#) en la que los obispos reflexionan sobre "las graves circunstancias que vivimos" y al mismo tiempo expresan un mensaje de esperanza.

Anhelo de vivir en democracia

"Los venezolanos quieren vivir en democracia": este es el pasaje clave de la Exhortación Pastoral emitida el 10 de julio, por la Conferencia Episcopal de Venezuela (CEV) al final de su 114ª Asamblea Ordinaria. El documento, largo y articulado en veinte párrafos, fue presentado a la prensa.

Comienza con un versículo del Deuteronomio, "Dios está contigo; no te dejará ni te abandonará" (31,6), el texto toma, en primer lugar, una fotografía muy amarga del país: "Vivimos inmersos en un caos generalizado presente en todos los niveles de la vida social y personal", escriben los obispos, señalando "la ausencia de servicios públicos básicos; la acción política desvinculada del bien común y del desarrollo; la inseguridad; la vulnerabilidad de la vida familiar; la inflación; la parálisis de las instituciones".

El drama que viven los venezolanos

A todo ello hay que añadir la pandemia de Covid-19 que agravó "la crisis ya existente", poniendo de relieve "la debilidad del sistema de salud", el drama de "los migrantes que regresan al país, sin recursos y sin perspectivas de una vida segura", el empobrecimiento

de la población en riesgo de hambre, el "alarmante" aumento del desempleo, mientras "las instituciones no responden a las violaciones de los derechos humanos". El anhelo de democracia es, por lo tanto, muy sentido por los venezolanos. Y por eso la CEV pide "elecciones libres e imparciales", en lugar de "un régimen más preocupado por permanecer en el poder que por el bienestar del pueblo". "Denunciamos como inmoral cualquier maniobra que obstruya la solución social y política de los problemas reales", aún leemos en la Exhortación que apunta el dedo a un "gobierno totalitario" en el que "la oposición es perseguida como nunca antes". "Pedimos una vez más - insisten los obispos - unas elecciones verdaderamente libres y democráticas", bajo la bandera de la "transparencia y la corrección", para "establecer un nuevo gobierno de cambio e inclusión nacional que nos permita construir el país que todos queremos". "No podemos quedarnos quietos y mirar", continúa el mensaje, instando a que se dé prioridad a "la calidad de vida y la supervivencia del pueblo", porque "nuestro pueblo está muriendo y cada día está más desesperado". Por otro lado, esta es también "la misión" que los obispos asumen como pastores, es decir, "defender al pueblo, especialmente a los pobres y necesitados, ofreciendo motivaciones basadas en la fe que den esperanza a todos".

Acciones esperanzadoras

La exhortación obisposCEV expresa su aprecio y gratitud por las numerosas iniciativas de asistencia social llevadas a cabo en tiempos de pandemia: "Los párrocos, las Cáritas parroquiales y los movimientos religiosos, incluso los no católicos -señalan los obispos- han aportado su contribución", convirtiéndose así en "luz en medio de las tinieblas". "Agradecemos a los trabajadores de la salud la dedicación, el sacrificio y el amor demostrado en el desempeño de su servicio profesional -dice el documento- y exhortamos a las autoridades sanitarias competentes a que proporcionen al personal médico todos los instrumentos, equipos y prendas de vestir necesarios para desempeñar su profesión con seguridad, con el fin de salvar vidas".

Fuertes, pues, con la esperanza de que "descanse única y exclusivamente en Dios y su Palabra", los obispos nos exhortan a creer aún más, porque "donde parece no haber solución, las sorpresas de Dios pueden aparecer de las maneras más inesperadas y en los momentos más inesperados". De ahí el llamamiento a los cristianos, "llamados a reconstruir la realidad venezolana, impregnándola con la oración y el poder transformador del Evangelio". De manera especial, los prelados invitan a los fieles a "renovar la opción preferencial por los

pobres", involucrando a todos los sectores de la sociedad.

Se hace otro llamamiento a la política para "esforzarse por servir al bien común". Los políticos católicos, sobre todo, "guiados por la Doctrina Social de la Iglesia", están invitados a "dirigir y trabajar por un cambio radical de la situación del país", no sobre la base de "intereses personales", sino en nombre del "bien común y el servicio al pueblo". En cuanto a los responsables de la justicia, se les recomienda "ser verdaderamente eficaces en la defensa de los derechos humanos de los ciudadanos", garantizando verdaderamente su seguridad. "Rechazamos la tortura, condenada por todas las convenciones internacionales, y pedimos su total eliminación", declaran los obispos, que se suman al grito lanzado por el pueblo a las organizaciones internacionales: "No nos dejen solos.

Finalmente, como el mes pasado, la CEV expresa la alegría, suya y de toda la nación, por el anuncio de la próxima beatificación de José Gregorio Hernández Cisneros, conocido como "el doctor de los pobres", autorizado por el Papa Francisco el 19 de junio. Una noticia que los prelados interpretan como "un nuevo gesto de amor y misericordia de Dios Padre". La exhortación pastoral concluye con la invocación a Nuestra Señora de Coromoto, Patrona de Venezuela, para que obtenga para el pueblo "la gracia de ser constructora de justicia, paz, libertad y amor".
