A number of years back I was introduced to the author M. Scott Peck, a psychologist whose best known work is a book entitled 'The Road Less Traveled'. The first sentence in that book reads; LIFE IS DIFFICULT. Sometime after publishing this best seller Peck wrote a follow up work entitled Further Along the Road Less Traveled. The first line in that book is LIFE IS COMPLEX. I can't remember a whole lot more of what I read in those two books but I will always remember these opening statements. Peck's point is that once we accept the truth that life is difficult and complex then we can get on with the business of figuring out how to live with the difficulties and complexities. According to Peck the problem is that we spend a lot of time and energy saying that life shouldn't be this way – that life should be easier and that life should be simpler. Living in the SHOULD can only make us frustrated, reactive and even angry. We all have heard the expression 'it is what it is' – accepting the reality of the moment challenges us to respond to the present situation in a realistic and hopefully serene way, changing the things we can, accepting those we can't and wisely knowing the difference between the two. This mantra taken from the well-known and often prayed Serenity Prayer is grounded in surrendering our control to God and letting God take the lead. Without God, facing the truth of a difficult and complex situation could lead to despair and hopelessness. Maybe that is why some folks choose the way of denial. With God, and tapping into the faith, hope and love that he has planted deep within our hearts and souls, we find the strength we need to face our challenges and to grow through them into better versions of ourselves.

Lately I have heard a number of people expressing their feelings that this pandemic should have been over by now. Truth is that it is not. Nor are the continuing efforts to address the racial inequalities that need to be truthfully acknowledged and radically changed. Nor is the mean spirited political rhetoric that is causing so many to tune out rather than tune in the news. We are in a time of sustained crisis that does not appear to have an immediate end in sight. The word 'crisis' has taken on a negative connotation in our society that fails to recognize the fuller meaning of the word – a time when a difficult and important decision must be made. From this wider perspective we can ask ourselves what decision will I make in this moment. As disciples and as Church, as followers of Jesus Christ, I believe that it must be a decision to love. What is the next loving thing that I am called to do in response to the pandemic. What is the next loving thing that I am called to do to respond to the cries with justice for people of color. What is the next loving thing that I am called to do to respond to the politics of our country as we move towards a presidential election. When we do the next loving thing we surrender to a greater love that is drawing us to the future that God desires for our Church, our nation and our world. Saint Oscar Romero with his life and with his words proclaimed that love must triumph. Strive with me to live under that banner my friends, collaborating with God in creating a better future of justice, love, mercy and peace.




16TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME – JULY 19, 2020

This past fall, as part of my SVM youth ministry commitment, many of my fellow classmates and I went to Paterson to volunteer at Eva's Soup Kitchen. We witness first-hand the organization, preparation, and basic human kindness that goes into feeding lunch to 200+ people. This was an experience that created a lasting impression.

The impact of Covid has negatively affected many and interrupted the daily life of all. Yet at Eva's Soup Kitchen, they continue to feed those in need. In March, Eva's Kitchen temporarily switched from gathering daily to share meals to a "meals-to-go program" in order to abide by health and safety guidelines.

St. Vincent Martyr Parish and St. Vincent Martyr Youth Ministry has long partnered with Eva's Village to help serve and feed a community of working poor and homeless individuals and families. 

Entregado oficialmente en Honduras ayer lunes, al hospital El Carmen de Tegucigalpa de las Hermanas Carmelitas Misioneras de Santa Teresa, el equipo donado por el Papa Francisco. Estuvieron presentes en la ceremonia de entrega el Nuncio Apostólico, Monseñor Gabor Pinter, el Arzobispo de Tegucigalpa, Cardenal Oscar Rodríguez Maradiaga, el Vicario General de la Arquidiócesis, padre Carlo Magno Núñez y el Secretario del Nuncio, Monseñor José Antonio Rodríguez. El Nuncio apostólico hizo la bendición del equipo de bioseguridad.

Patricia Ynestroza-Ciudad del Vaticano

En medio de la difícil situación que vive Honduras por la pandemia del coronavirus y sus trágicas consecuencias, ayer lunes Suyapa Medios, de la Iglesia Católica del país, transmitió el momento de la entrega oficial del equipo de bioseguridad que donó el Papa Francisco al país, una noticia positiva.

El equipo fue entregado por disposición de los obispos hondureños al Hospital El Carmen de Tegucigalpa de las Hermanas Carmelitas Misioneras de Santa Teresa, fundado hace 71 años. Los prelados del país expresaron este deseo, porque como comunicaron al nuncio y al cardenal, es en este hospital donde se encuentra el Buen Samaritano, dedicado a los seminaristas, los sacerdotes, las religiosas, y a los más vulnerables. Esta donación se ha entregado en el marco de la novena en honor a la Virgen del Carmen.

Recordamos el 26 de junio el Papa donó 35 respiradores a diferentes países para paliar los efectos de la emergencia sanitaria. Los países que recibieron su donación, han sido: Honduras, 3 respiradores; Haití, 4; República Dominicana, 2; Bolivia, 2; Brasil, 4; Colombia, 3; Ecuador, 2; México, 3; Venezuela, 4; Camerún, 2; Zimbabwue, 2; Bangladés, 2; Ucrania, 2.

Ayer lunes, fueron entregados al hospital los 3 respiradores pulmonares, sistemas de oxigenación, y un equipo médico básico que sirve para montar una unidad de cuidados intensivos.
