PASTOR'S MESSAGE

"Finally, draw your strength from the Lord and from his mighty power. Put on the armor of God so that you may be able to stand firm against the tactics of the devil. For our struggle is not with flesh and blood but with the principalities, with the powers, with the world rulers of this present darkness, with the evil spirits in the heavens." Eph 6:10-12

Rule 4 – Definition of Desolation

The fourth is of spiritual desolation. I call desolation all the contrary of the third rule, such as darkness of soul, disturbance in it, movement to low and earthly things, disquiet from various agitations and temptations, moving to lack of confidence, without hope, without love, finding oneself totally slothful, tepid, sad and, as if separated from one's Creator and Lord. For just as consolation is contrary to desolation, in the same way the thoughts that come from consolation are contrary to the thoughts that come from desolation.

One very important thing that I learned in seminary came from the 14 rules of spiritual discernment, written by St. Ignatius of Loyola. As rule four states above, the devil attacks us through spiritual desolation.

It is a great benefit to know when you are being attacked by the devil. A lot of people get hit by spiritual desolation and don't realize what is happening. That the devil is attacking them and they can do something to protect themselves. God loves us and wants to guide and protect us from the attacks of the devil. St. Ignatius' rules of discernment are a great gift from God to the Church to help us and protect us from the attacks from the evil one.

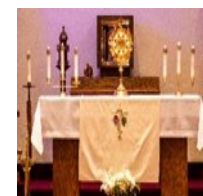
