<p>Additional COVID mass regulations</p> <p>Communion: Parishioners who receive communion at Mass are asked to receive it in the hand. If someone still wishes to receive communion on the tongue, they should be near the end of the communion line.</p> <p>Over-flow at St. Mary's: If the church reaches 25% capacity, the ushers will direct people to sit in either the gathering space or the dining hall and watch the live Mass on either TV screens. Those in over-flow are to enter the main church to receive communion with the rest of the people at communion time.</p> <p>Over-flow at St. Patrick's: If the church reaches 25% capacity, the ushers will direct people to stand outside the church building or sit in their car and listen to the mass via loud speaker broadcast outside. We hope to have one available soon if we need it. At communion time Fr. PASTOR'S CORNER

"Jesus said to the Jewish crowds: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." The Jews quarreled among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him."

Today we celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi – The body and blood of Christ. This Feast reminds us of the unbelievable treasure of the Eucharist. It is an amazing mystery: God gives us His real body, blood, soul and divinity to eat at every Mass. The Eucharist is not just a symbol; it is the real presence of His actual body and blood. When the priest says the prayers of consecration at Mass, the bread and wine are miraculously changed and are not bread and wine any more. They become the real body and blood of Jesus. The host still looks and tastes like bread and the wine still looks and tastes like wine, but it is not bread and wine.

It is very important for us to understand the truth about the Eucharist so that we can appreciate the gift and treasure. Why do we believe this? Because Jesus said so. He is very clear in John 6 about the fact that the bread and wine are his real body and blood. I encourage everyone to look up the Church's teaching on the Eucharist in the Catechism. The more we know our faith and believe the more we are able to share the treasure with others.

REVISED ANNOUNCEMENT!

Bishop Quinn and all the Bishops of Minnesota have given permission for the resumption of the public celebration of Mass to 25% capacity. No one is obliged to attend and the obligation to attend Sunday Mass is removed until further notice.

Volunteers Needed

- Please donate sanitizer wipes (purchased or home-made) to the Church. Sanitizer wipes are quite difficult to locate and oftentimes they are not in stock or are sold very quickly. Mass goers will be asked to wipe down their seat after Mass with a sanitizing wipe provided by the church.
- Help wipe down commonly used surfaces i.e., door handles, light switches, bathroom surfaces, etc. after each Mass.
- Ushers needed for Saturday & Sunday, call the office to sign up. Please see Father 20 minutes before Mass for special instructions on seating people
- Greeters needed to remind people to pick up a baggie with a sanitized wipe before Mass. No Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion needed as Father and Deacon only will distribute Holy Communion.

General Safety Reminders:

- When coming forward for Holy Communion, please keep a 6-foot distance between each person
- People are asked to not shake hands or greet each other by touching
- The obligation to attend Sunday Mass is removed until further notice. The Diocesan Safety Regulations advise that those who are 65 or older or have health issues to stay home but each person should make their own decision
- Please wash your hands often, use hand sanitizer and sneeze or cough into your arm
