PASTOR'S MESSAGE

"Sin speaks to the sinner; his eyes are closed to the fear of the Lord. For he lives with the delusion: his guilt will not be known and hated. Empty and false are the words of his mouth; he has ceased to be wise and do good. On his bed he hatches plots; he sets out on a wicked way; he does not reject evil." Ps 36:1-5

trick or treating for the food shelf and end with a pizza party. Thanks, Fr. Fasnacht

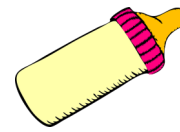


Knight's of Columbus will meet on Tuesday, November 9th. We will start with the Rosary in church at 6:20 PM and the meeting will follow in the hall
