PASTOR'S MESSAGE

"As they continued their journey he entered a village where a woman whose name was Martha welcomed him. She had a sister named Mary who sat beside the Lord at his feet listening to him speak. Martha, burdened with much serving, came to him and said, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving? Tell her to help me." The Lord said to her in reply, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her." Lk 10:38-42

**St. Junipero Serra:**

We celebrate the Feast Day of the Serra Club Patron saint on July 1st.

Did you know:

*He was born Miquel Jose Serra, 1713, on the island of Mallorca, off the coast of Spain.
*He entered the Franciscan Order taking the name, Junipero, which means "Jester of

God", after the childlike companion of St. Francis.

*He was a student and professor of philosophy famous for his preaching.

*At age 25 he followed his desire to convert Native people in the New World beginning in Mexico City with the Pame Indians and preaching across central Mexico.

*After being appointed in charge of the missions in California, he became known as the "Apostle of California" having founded many missions in what would become the major cities there.
*He converted thousands of Native Americans to Christianity as well as teaching them the sound practices of agriculture, cattle raising, arts and crafts. He frequently confronted the government on their behalf.

*He had a great devotion to the Blessed Mother, particularly Our Lady of Guadalupe. He offered the success of his missions to her intercession.

*Despite having asthma and a chronic leg wound he traveled on foot whenever possible. He had an absolute trust in God and his efforts were, "Always Forward, Never Back."

*He died in 1784 and was referred by generations as "El Santo"- The Saint- He was canonized as a Saint in 2015 by Pope Francis in the U.S.

QUOTE FROM MOTHER THERESA....

Mary Showed complete trust in God by agreeing to be used as an instrument in His plan. She trusted Him in spite of her nothingness, because she knew He could do great things in her and through her. Once she said "yes" to God, Mary never doubted. She was just a young woman, but she belonged to God and nothing nor anyone could separate her from Him.
