Jesus said, "My father's house is a house of prayer." He was angry because his father's house had become a market place, filled with people buying and selling instead of being a place of prayer and respect. Our Gospel today teaches us a valuable lesson. We see our Lord use his anger to correct a bad situation. There are so many incidents in the Gospels when we see Christ expressing the greatest patience. But in our Gospel today we see Jesus use fraternal correction because charity is more powerful than patience in the situation. Now, let us look at this Gospel. Many times we may find ourselves angry. Most Catholics think that it is a sin to experience the emotion of anger. No emotion in itself is a sin. When we might find ourselves angry that very emotion can give us an insight that we have a choice. We can use that anger to our own and others benefit. Or we can do or say things that hurt others and therefore commit a sin. A parent might get angry with his / her child. But the correction can only be effective if it is done out of love. As a community we gather here each Sunday to celebrate the Eucharist and thank God for the week that has passed. God wants and desires us to worship him with more than words and external behavior. Worship means saying to God: "How great Thou art." It is our response when we recognize the goodness of God in our lives and know that, because the Lord is our shepherd, there is nothing we shall want. Worship and the way we live are not meant to be cut off from one another. As well as going to church on Sunday, we are called to be the Church in our society during the week. Feel at home here in your Father's house. Mother Church tells us: "Let us make the house of our Father as pretty, as homey as we can." God bless you all.
