Lent is well and truly over. We are deeply immersed in the Easter season, celebrating Christ's victory over death. Yet today's readings focus on the necessity of repentance, conversion and the avoidance of sin. As Christians we must always remember that in order to share in the life of the Risen Christ we have first to share in the life of the crucified Christ. There are no shortcuts to Eternal life — if there is no cross there is no crown. Death and resurrection must take place in each of our lives. We have to die to self in order to live for God. The two disciples on the road to Emmaus were confused and distressed over the death of the Lord. They did not recognize Jesus. Today, many people may have the wrong idea about who Jesus is. While he walked this earth, he was merciful, humble, gentle and simple. It was not until the disciples sat down at the table and broke bread with Christ, that their eyes were opened and they recognized him. When the Lord changed bread and wine into his Body and Blood and told the Apostles to "do this in memory of me." It was taken seriously and people who loved him began to understand the New Covenant. The two disciples recognized Jesus in the breaking of the bread. This is the beginning of the New Covenant that is written with the Blood of Christ. Holy Scripture states that the disciples' hearts were burning inside them. May we, as God's chosen people always burn inside with the desire to be close to our Risen Lord. Lord Jesus, send us your Spirit to give us the strength to live as you taught us. Help us to bear witness to you by our actions and our words.

3rd Sunday of Easter: April 18

That we have the courage to do the work God has sent us to do, knowing that this is the true path to peace and joy. "Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you.' But they were startled and frightened..." - Luke 24:36-37 Throughout the day we have many opportunities to "see the face of Jesus" in others and to "be the face of Jesus" to others. Do we take that opportunity to provide "peace" to those we encounter or are we afraid of what others will think of us and do nothing? Pray for the strength to live a "God-centered" life and not a "self-centered" life.
