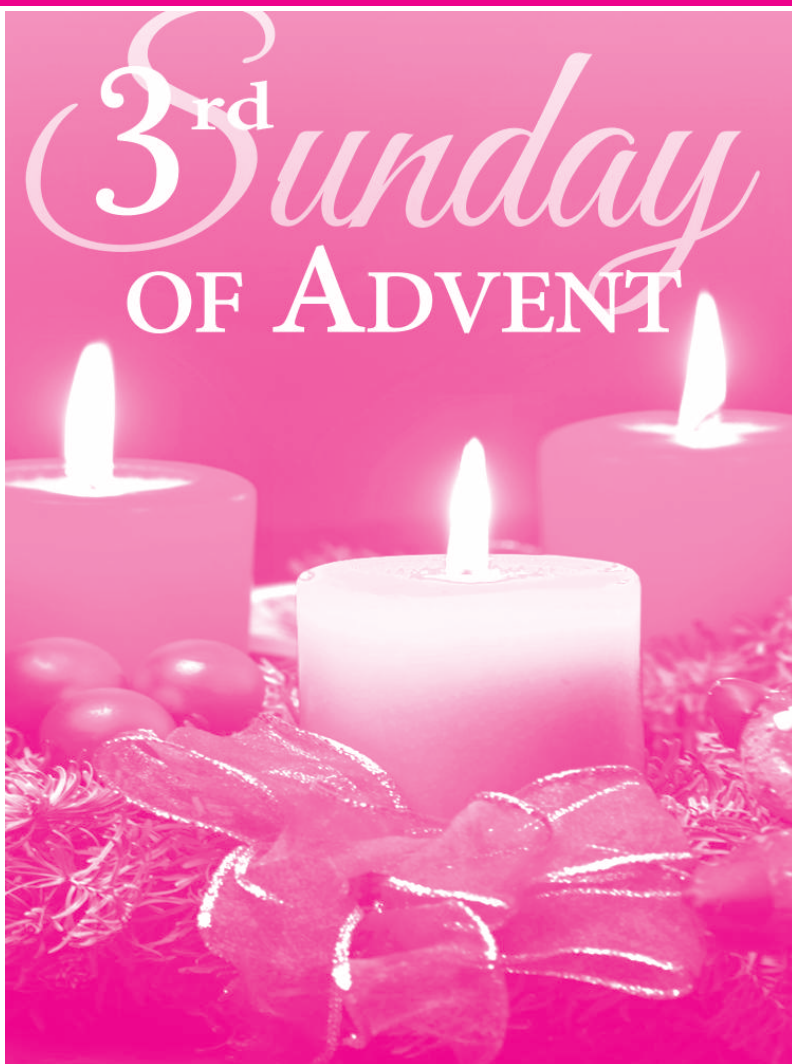

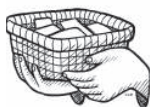

Topic: Holy Catholic Church and the Communion of Saints

Indissolubility of Marriage

December 3, 2015 ([LifeSiteNews](#)) -- It is impossible for the recently concluded Synod on the Family to have opened a door to allowing Holy Communion to Catholics who have been civilly divorced and remarried because such a door “does not exist and cannot exist” within the Catholic Church, wrote Cardinal Raymond Burke, patron of the Sovereign Military Order of Malta, in a December 1 article appearing in National Catholic Register.

Cardinal Burke said: “The fact is that the [recent] synod could not open a door which does not exist and cannot exist, namely, a discernment in conscience which contradicts the truth about the supreme sanctity of the Most Holy Eucharist and the indissolubility of the marriage bond.”

“The synod, as the Church has always taught and practiced, has wanted to show love towards the individual who finds himself in a situation which is not coherent with the teaching of Christ and his Church,” Cardinal Burke wrote. He said that “Christlike love” of individuals living in irregular unions is “accompan[ing] the individual on the way to repentance and reparation, so that he can once again be disposed to meet Christ in the sacraments.”

“To give the impression that there is another practice in the ‘internal forum,’ which would permit an individual in an irregular union to have access to the sacraments, is to suggest that the conscience can be in conflict with the truth of the faith. Such a suggestion clearly places priests in an impossible situation, the expectation that they can ‘open a door’ for the penitent, which, in fact, does not exist and cannot exist,” he wrote.

“Ultimately and to the most serious harm of the universal Church, it creates the expectation that the Roman pontiff can sanction a practice which is in conflict with the truths of the faith. The Synod of Bishops, in accord with its nature and purpose, cannot be the instrument of such an expectation,” he concluded.

Earlier in October, Cardinal Burke [raised serious concerns](#) about the Synod’s Final Report, calling it misleading and lacking clarity on crucial Church teaching. He criticized the Synod’s proposal that civilly divorced and remarried Catholic be “more integrated” as “theologically ambiguous.”

Why HB 469 (to keep separate boys/girls bath/shower rooms) is important: Look what’s happening in Illinois:

Palatine-Schaumburg, Illinois School District 211, after being pressured by the Obama Administration’s U.S. Dept. of Education’s Office for Civil Rights (OCR) and the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU), agreed to allow gender-dysphoric students (e.g., males who claim they are “females”) to use opposite-sex restrooms and to allow gender-dysphoric boys into the girls’ locker room – but they were to use private changing areas. But that was not good enough for the OCR and the ACLU.

The OCR publicly claimed that the district is in error in claiming that boys must use private, separate changing areas in the girls’ locker room; and in one case the OCR and ACLU insist that a boy (who identifies himself as a girl) must be allowed complete access to the girls’ locker room, shower area, etc. – or else the school district will lose federal funding and be sued under Title IX of the U.S. Civil Rights Act, which prohibits discrimination based upon (among other things) “sex.” The ACLU posted this statement:

We also remain disturbed by the inaccurate, misleading and fundamentally troubling language used by the District, even as they adopt this agreement. For example, the District said last night that transgender students who are provided access to locker rooms consistent with their gender identity “will utilize a private changing station when changing clothes or showering” and will not be allowed unrestricted access to the locker room. This is not what the agreement with OCR provides. The agreement specifically says that “based on Student A’s representation that she will change in private changing stations in the girls’ locker rooms, the District agrees to provide Student A access to locker room facilities designated for female students at school.” **Nowhere does the agreement require Student A to use a private area to dress and such a requirement would be blatantly discriminatory.** [emphasis added]

Steadfastly refusing to allow an objectively male student unfettered access to the girls’ locker room is a very good decision on the part of District 211. (Source: takeaction@illinoisfamily.org, 12/5/15.)

The above scenario is why we need HB 469 passed and signed into law in Wisconsin, which will guarantee separate bath/shower rooms for males & females). Be sure to contact our state representatives Tod Ohnstad (608) 266-0455 and Peter Barca (608) 266-5504, and State Sen. Bob Wirth (608) 267-8979, and demand that they support this bill!

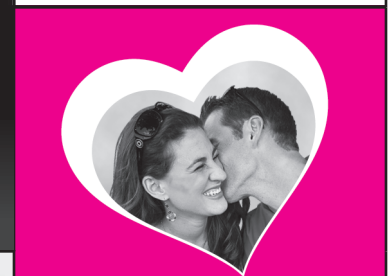
