

A Suitable Partner

In the story of the creation of the first woman, the Hebrew word *ezer* is used to describe her relationship with the first man. Many Bibles translate that word as “helper” or “helpmate,” thus making the woman an addition to the man. The *Lectionary* translates the word as “suitable partner,” emphasizing mutuality rather than subservience. Since the word is generally used for divine assistance, it certainly does not imply inferiority.

Another important Hebrew word is *bad*, usually translated as “alone.” A common meaning is “separated from,” implying incompleteness in a relationship. This incompleteness is remedied when the man is given a suitable partner, one who is as intimate a companion to him as are his bones.

The intimacy of this relationship of mutuality is found in the Gospel passage as well. There the focus is

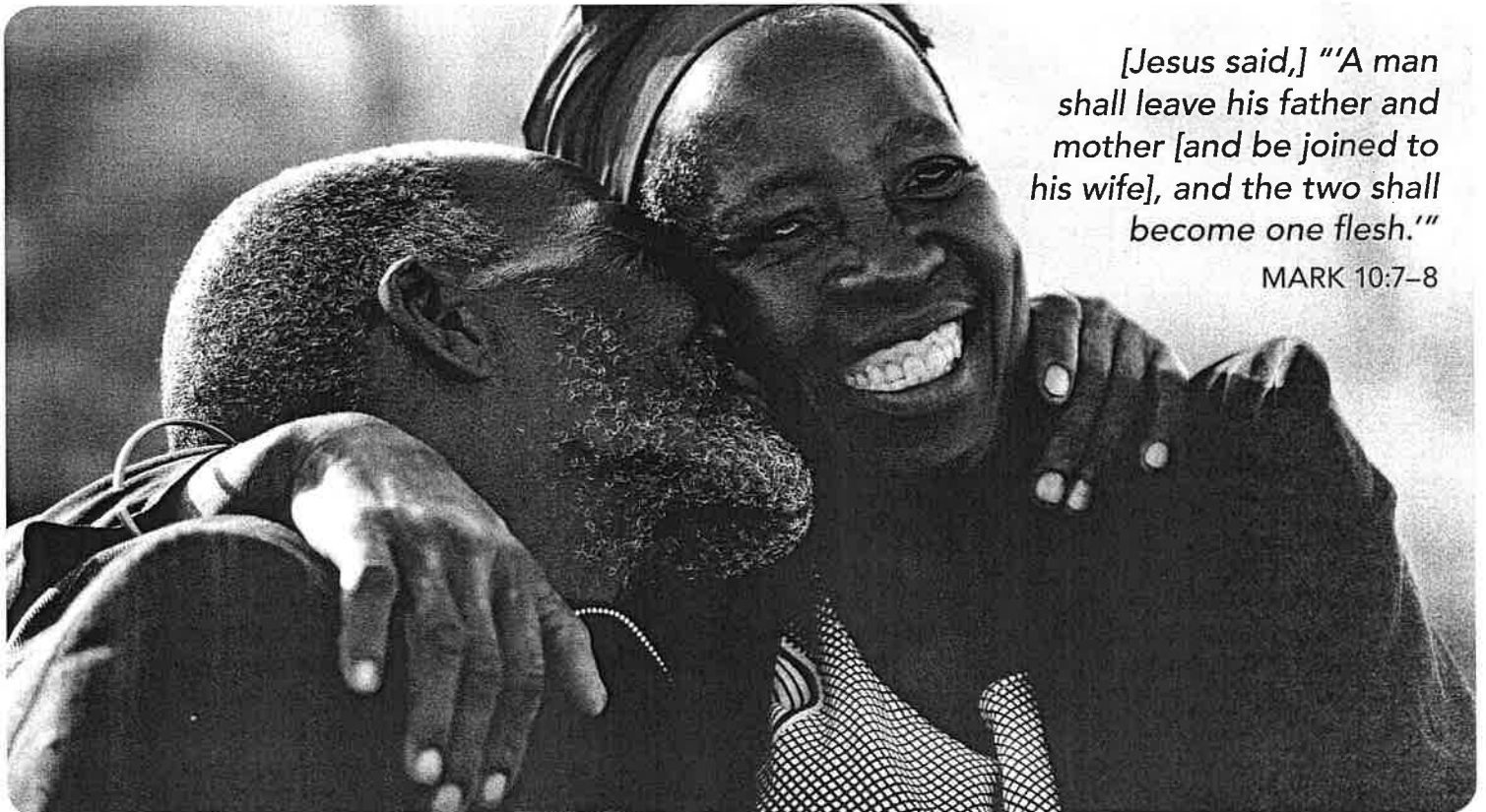
on the endurance of the relationship. Jesus insists that the bond that joins the couple together must not be severed. Many today might find this ruling too rigid. Things can happen in intimate relationships; partners can grow apart; staying together could become dangerous. While these are valid concerns today, women in the patriarchal society of the time would see Jesus’ interpretation of the law as protecting them. By law only men could divorce their wives, and reasons for doing so could be as trivial as poor cooking.

Today’s readings remind us of our need for intimate relationships of mutuality. They further underscore how important it is to cherish such relationships and to nurture them by respecting our partners.

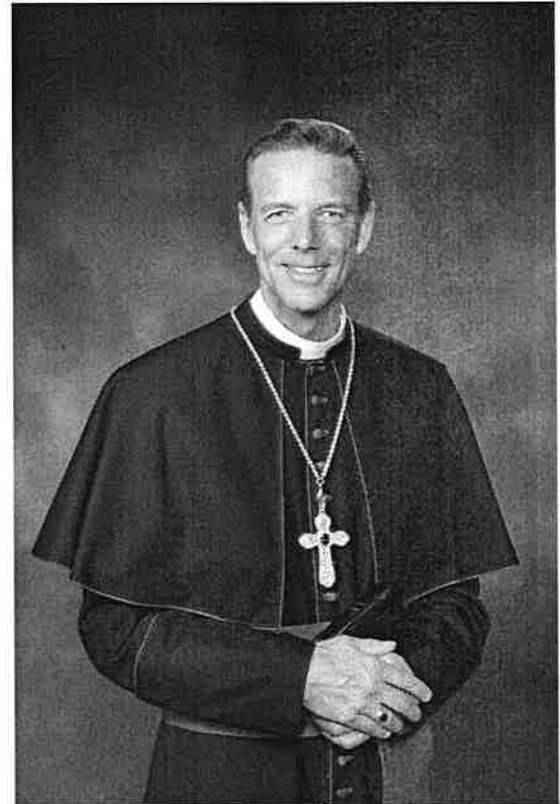

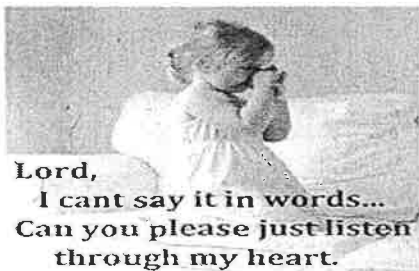

What is The Cursillo Movement?

The word Cursillo is derived from the Spanish language and means "short course in Christianity". Cursillo is an international movement to renew and revitalize Christians around the world. Involvement with Cursillo typically begins with an invitation to go to a Cursillo Weekend by a friend that is an active member of the local Cursillo movement.

The purpose (or goal) of the movement is to make Christian communities possible in neighborhoods, parishes, work situations and other places where people live the greater part of their lives. It makes it possible for anyone to live a Christian life in thoughts, words, and actions in a natural way. Since it is a movement of the Church, the Cursillo movement has the same apostolic purpose as the Church herself. The Cursillo movement provides a method for people to live what is fundamental for being a Christian. Cursillo helps people discover and fulfill their personal vocations, and promotes the creation of groups of Christians who leaven their environments with the Gospel.

The Cursillo Weekend – What is it like?

The initial Cursillo weekend is a **72-hour experience** designed for Christian renewal. The weekend includes a number of activities which, put together, make a very effective tool for bringing a new vigor to Christian life by giving participants a new awareness of living a life filled with God's grace. During a Cursillo weekend, people travel to a retreat center on Thursday night and live there until Sunday evening. Those that have special needs, such as a particular diet or physical needs, will be attended to properly.

What Happens After the Cursillo Weekend?

The Weekend is just the introduction to the Cursillo Movement and your attendance signals your commitment to join your local group and regularly attend their meetings. Cursillo groups are the backbone of the Cursillo Movement. Groups are all about joining a local group of Christian friends that meet regularly to share their spiritual growth, as well as, journey towards becoming a person who strives to bring a Christ-like attitude to their environments.

You will also be invited to meet monthly with the larger Cursillo community in your area. This meeting is called a Ultreya and your local Ultreya provides the opportunity to strengthen your relationships with members of other local Cursillo groups and bring others to the Cursillo Movement.

Who Should Go to Cursillo?

Cursillo is for practicing Catholics who are:

- Trying to live their Catholic lives as best as they know how,
- Free to participate fully in the sacramental life of the Catholic church,
- Seeking opportunities to deepen their relationship with Jesus and their friendships within their parish community,
- Active in the life of their parish and often the backbone of parish programs.

What do to go the new weekend and join the Cursillo Movement?

You must complete and return the registration form with a \$125 check to your Cursillo Sponsor by November 14th.

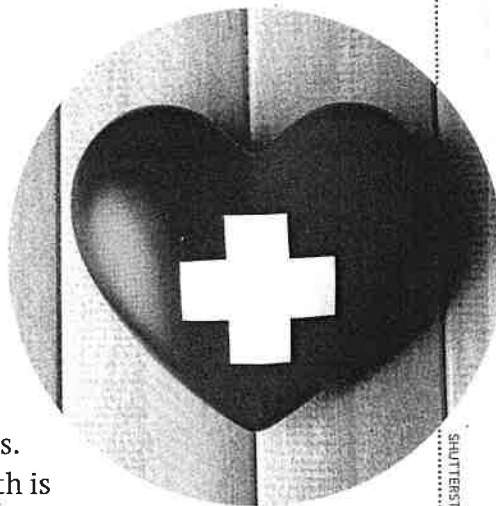
Dear Padre,

I just got my new driver's license, and my wife is encouraging me to sign up to be an organ donor. Are organ transplants permitted by the Catholic Church?

Yes, under certain conditions. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* affirms that "organ transplants are in conformity with the moral law if the physical and psychological dangers and risks to the donor are proportionate to the good that is sought for the recipient" (CCC 2296).

Organ transplants from a dead person to a living person must fulfill two additional criteria: First, the donor must give free and informed consent prior to death, or those who legitimately speak on the donor's behalf must do so at the time of death. And second, the donor must be dead before the tissue can be harvested—in other words, the donor must not be declared dead prematurely, nor may the donor's death be hastened just to use the organs. The *Catechism* adds, "Organ donation after death is a noble and meritorious act and is to be encouraged as an expression of generous solidarity."

The transplantation of organs from a living donor must fulfill two criteria: First, the removal of the organ must not seriously impair the donor's health or bodily function. Second, the donor must make an informed and free decision recognizing the potential risks involved.
