First Reading: Proverbs 8:22-31

Solemnity of Pentecost

Happy Pentecost Sunday! Today is an opportunity to experience the presence and the power of the Holy Spirit. The roots of Pentecost can be found in the Jewish festival of Weeks (Shavuot), the fifty-day celebration following Passover. The Greek word for Pentecost (*Pentekoste*) means “fiftieth,” and in early Christianity it referred to the entire fifty days of Easter. Early Christians reinterpreted the Jewish festival as a commemoration of the coming of the Holy Spirit since Acts records that the Holy Spirit came to the disciples when the festival of Pentecost was fulfilled (see Acts 2:1-11).

Pentecost celebrates not only the completion of Easter, but its fruition as we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit. “For, bringing your Paschal Mystery to completion, you bestowed the Holy Spirit today on those you made your adopted children by uniting them to your Only Begotten Son. This same Spirit, as the Church came to birth, opened to all peoples the knowledge of God and brought together the many languages of the earth in profession of the one faith” (Preface of Pentecost). These, then, are the themes we celebrate today: the completion of the Paschal Mystery, the coming of the Holy Spirit, adoption through union with Christ, and the communion of the Church and in faith.

With the completion of the Easter Season, we return to Ordinary Time on Monday and the paschal candle is returned to the baptismal font and is lit only for baptisms and funerals. With that said, from the moment of our baptism, we are people of the Spirit. The Spirit dwells within us and is constantly increased and strengthened by the grace of God. As it did for the disciples, the Holy Spirit fills us and prompts us to do incredible things. “Come Holy Spirit. Fill the hearts of your faithful. Kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your spirit and they shall be created and you shall renew the face of the earth. Amen.”

Father’s Day Collection

Next weekend, our second collection will be for Seminarian Education. This is an additional way to support our future spiritual Fathers. We have the unique opportunity to see seminarians first-hand. Sebastian and Carlos are a sign of hope for our Church. We have a role in their formation; helping them in a special way to adapt to a new culture. Support of this collection is an affirmation of their decision to study for the Priesthood and an acknowledgement of their call to serve God by serving His people. As always, thank you for your kindness.

Catholic Heart Work Camp Youth Trip

This year ten teenagers of our parish will once again participate in *Catholic Heart Work Camp*. The week of July 14-20, they will be traveling to Boston. This is our third year participating in this “faith in action” trip. This summer, over 13,000 participants will serve throughout the country in different cities. *CHWC* provides teenagers and adult leaders service opportunities to restore homes, feed the hungry, lift the spirits of children, and bring joy to the lonely. Each “camp” is equipped with a staff, director, manager, musician, nurse, and priests to celebrate the Sacraments. Participants have an opportunity to share their faith with peers, increase their faith through catechesis and prayer, and put their faith into action by working each day in different locations and capacities. I am grateful to all of you for your support of our young people on this experience. Please continue to pray for them as their faith is strengthened and put into practice.
