First Reading: 2 Kings 5:14-17
 Elisha cures Naaman of leprosy, which convinces Naaman that there is only one God. Naaman then asks to take some loads of soil from Israel, so that he can worship and make sacrifices to one true God on his own land.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 2:8-13
 Paul reminds Timothy that Christ rose from the dead so that many people could be saved. Paul was being treated as a criminal and kept in chains but says, "There is no chaining the word of God!" Paul also says, "if we die in Christ, we will live in him. But if we deny him, he will deny us."

Gospel: Luke 17:11-19
 Jesus cures ten lepers, but only one returns to express gratitude for being healed. Jesus is disappointed that only one gave thanks to God, but tells that one, "Your faith has been your salvation."

Canonization of Sr. Dulce Pontes, SMIC

On Sunday, October 13, Pope Francis will canonize five new saints in the Church: John Henry Newman, Sr. Mariam Thresia, Sr. Giuseppina Vannini, Sr. Dulce Lopes Pontes, and Sr. Margarita Bays. One of the new saints, St. Dulce of the Poor (Sr. Dulce Lopes Pontes) is part of the Missionary Sisters of the Immaculate Conception. We are privileged at St. Catherine's to have in our parish Sisters from her community. They worship with us and serve in different ministries of the parish. St. Dulce of the Poor will be the first native Brazilian woman to be canonized. She is at times referred to as "Brazil's Mother Teresa." One of our parishioners, Sr. Jane Abeln, SMIC will travel to Rome for the canonization and Sr. Eleanor Goekler, SMIC will participate in the American celebration in Paterson this December. It is always a joy to hear of new saints who have lived in our time. They give us hope and encouragement to live out our call to holiness. We thank God for the miracles and many graces that have already resulted from St. Dulce's intercession.

Celebrating the Joy & Blessings of the Season

The thought of Christmas sounds a long way off (especially from a liturgical point of view). However, I'd like you to save the date for our fifth *Celebrating the Joy & Blessings of the Season*. Since 2015 we have presented an annual Christmas concert, featuring artists such as Ronan Tynan, Anthony Rodriguez, Imperial Brass Orchestra, and Will & Anthony. Each year it is a wonderful evening of entertainment and socialization. ***It is a great opportunity to relax in the midst of the December busyness, build community with fellow parishioners and others from outside, and to support the parish.*** This year, the concert will be on **Saturday, December 7 at 8 pm**. Once again, we bring to St. Catherine's high caliber talent. This year we welcome **Chanticleer**. Tickets will be \$50 with open seating and a wine and cheese reception to follow.

Chanticleer is one of Billboard Magazine's Top 10 best-selling classical artists. Since the 12-voice male ensemble began releasing recordings in 1981, the group has sold well over a million albums and won two GRAMMY awards. *Chanticleer* was named Ensemble of the Year by Musical America in 2008, and inducted in the American Classical Music Hall of Fame the same year. Founded in San Francisco in 1978, *Chanticleer* is known around the world as "an orchestra of voices" for the seamless blend of its twelve male voices ranging from countertenor to bass and its original interpretations of vocal literature, from Renaissance to jazz, and from gospel to venturesome new music.

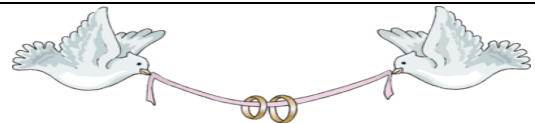
