**Scripture Readings
 October 20, 2019
 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time**

First Reading: Exodus 17:8-13

Amalek and his people attacked the Israelites, so Moses instructed Joshua to lead some of the Israelites into battle the next day. While Moses kept his hands raised in prayer, the Israelites were winning. But when he put his hands down, they would begin to lose. So two others helped him keep his hands raised, and Joshua and the Israelites won the battle.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 3:14-4:2

Paul tells Timothy that the Scriptures are inspired by God and are an excellent tool in teaching others about God's expectations of his people. Knowledge of the Scriptures, coupled with faith in Jesus, will lead many people to salvation. Paul urges Timothy to continue preaching the gospel, although this will sometimes be a difficult task.

Gospel: Luke 18:1-8

Jesus speaks about a corrupt judge who lacked respect for either God or man. A widow repeatedly asked him to settle a case in her favor. He finally settled the case, only because he grew weary of listening to her requests. Jesus points out that if even this corrupt judge eventually listened, then God, who is just, will certainly answer the pleas of his people.

Anthony Newman Organ Recital

The Music Ministry of St. Catherine's is happy to present an afternoon of music with Anthony Newman. Described by Wynton Marsalis as "The High Priest of Bach", and by Time Magazine as "The High Priest of the Harpsichord," Newman is one of America's leading organist, harpsichordist and Bach specialist. He has created more than 170 CDs on such labels as CBS, SONY, Deutsche Grammophon, and Vox Masterworks. In 1989, Stereo Review voted his original instrument recording of Beethoven's Third Piano Concerto as "Record of the Year". His collaboration with Wynton Marsalis on Sony's "In Gabriel's Garden" was the best-selling classical CD in 1997.

Mr. Newman has performed more than sixty times at Lincoln Center and has collaborated with many of the greats of music: Kathleen Battle, Itzhak Perlman, Eugenia Zukerman, John Nelson, Jean-Pierre Rampal, James Levine, Lorin Mazel, Mstislav Rostropovich, Seiji Osawa, and Leonard Bernstein. He has conducted chamber music orchestras including: St. Paul Chamber, LA Chamber, Budapest Chamber, Scottish Chamber, and the 92nd St. Y Chamber Orchestras. Larger symphonic groups include: Seattle (over 40 appearances), Los Angeles, San Diego, Calgary, Denver, and New York Philharmonic Orchestras.

Mr. Newman is Music Director of "Bach Works," New York's all Bach association, and Bedford Chamber Concerts; serves on the Visiting Committee for the Department of Musical Instruments at the Metropolitan Museum of Art; and on the board of the Musical Quarterly Magazine. As a person committed to outreach, he was a volunteer for Stamford Hospital, a member of Hospice International from 1995 to 2004. Newman is music director of St. Matthews Episcopal Church in Bedford NY.

The recital will take place on **Sunday, November 3 at 4 pm** in the church. Admission is free and a light reception will follow in the gymnasium.

Celebrating the Joy & Blessings of the Season

The thought of Christmas sounds a long way off (especially from a liturgical point of view). However, I'd like you to save the date for our fifth *Celebrating the Joy & Blessings of the Season*. Since 2015 we have presented an annual Christmas concert, featuring artists such as Ronan Tynan, Anthony Rodriguez, Imperial Brass Orchestra, and Will & Anthony. Each year it is a wonderful evening of entertainment and socialization. ***It is a great opportunity to relax in the midst of the December busyness, build community with fellow parishioners and others from outside, and to support the parish.***

This year, the concert will be on **Saturday, December 7 at 8 pm**. Once again, we bring to St. Catherine's high caliber talent. This year we welcome **Chanticleer**.

Chanticleer is one of Billboard Magazine's Top 10 best-selling classical artists. Since the 12-voice male ensemble began releasing recordings in 1981, the group has sold well over a million albums and won two GRAMMY awards. Chanticleer was named Ensemble of the Year by Musical America in 2008, and inducted in the American Classical Music Hall of Fame the same year. Founded in San Francisco in 1978, Chanticleer is known around the world as "an orchestra of voices" for the seamless blend of its twelve male voices ranging from countertenor to bass and its original interpretations of vocal literature, from Renaissance to jazz, and from gospel to venturesome new music.
