FROM FR. FRAN

Happy New Year!

This weekend we celebrate the beginning of the Liturgical Year with an exploration of the end of all things! The first weeks of Advent ask us to reflect on the time when Christ will come again, not in a manger, not on the cross, not out of an empty tomb but as the center of the universe. Notions of doom and gloom and wrath when he comes again are really misleading and false. Christ will come again to bring us to the fullness of life in the reign of God. Nothing to worry about here.

However, how ready are we if Christ decides to return tomorrow? Are all of our relationships with family and friends where we want them to be? Is there any unfinished business that has been nagging us for a while? Have we neglected people, put them down or ignored them in a way that would cause us to have significant regrets if the world came to an end tomorrow? Heavy stuff! Who has time for that, especially in December!

So many people say that the weeks between Thanksgiving and Christmas are the most stressful and hectic ones of the entire year. "If only I could have a moment of quiet or a stress free afternoon". Well, you can, because that's what Advent is all about! Just when we need it most, the Church gives us four weeks, (this year three weeks and one day!), to prepare our hearts and lives for the coming of Christ at Christmas and at the end of time.

I do believe that if we take advantage of what Advent offers us, we will experience a Christmas season full of inner peace no matter what our situation. The deal is, however, that we *do* have to work at it! You might say, "Uggghhh – not *another* thing to do this month," well, hear me out.

Doing the work of Advent means making a commitment to take some time for quiet prayer with God. Advent affords us the opportunity of *reflecting on* our Christmas preparations rather than just *flying through* them. Advent calls us to remember God's greatest gift to us in Jesus Christ as we prepare to purchase gifts for our loved ones and friends. Advent also calls us through the voice of John the Baptist to reform our ways this season. Ugggh again. You might say, "I barely have enough time and patience to *put up* with people let alone change the way in which I deal with them."

Well, are you getting the picture? Advent, if we really work at celebrating it, can transform us, our gift-giving, and our relationships with one another! Do you think it's worth the effort? Let's prepare well, and maybe in a whole new way, for the great feast of Christmas just three short weeks and one day away! Happy Advent everyone.

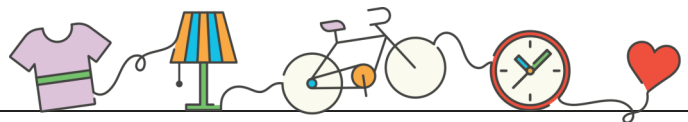
GIVING TO THOSE IN NEED

At this ‘giving’ time of year, SVdP and St. Matthias Parish would like to let you know about 2 wonderful local charities helping those in need in our area. If you can’t save furniture, household items, etc. for next year’s yard sale, please think of these charities before throwing out items!

Household Goods, Acton, MA (www.householdgoods.org) Every year, Household Goods helps approximately 8,000 people from 2,500 homes sleep in beds with sheets and blankets, eat at tables with dishes and cutlery and live with dignity in furnished rooms. As a volunteer run organization, Household Goods relies on the generous time donated by over 800 volunteers annually. It is a 501(C)(3) non-profit organization and relies on the generous financial donations of individuals and organizations to fulfill its mission.

Fresh Start Furniture Bank, Hudson, MA (www.freshstartfurniturebank.org) Fresh Start Furniture Bank provides furniture and household goods to families in need in Massachusetts. People in need obtain referrals to Fresh Start from over 250 social service agencies throughout the state. Fresh Start has received referrals from 668 families in Marlborough alone this year. They expect to help at least 500 families again next year.
