ST. JOSEPH THE WORKER – Although popular devotion to Joseph, husband of Mary, may have begun as early as the 8th century, it was not until the 15th century that his name was entered in the Church calendar. Since that time, devotions to Joseph has been marked by growing enthusiasm and, in 1955 Pope Pius XII proclaimed a second feast day on May 1st, which recognizes Joseph as the skilled craftsman and coincides with Labor Day in many countries.
