THE BLUE MASS – will be celebrated on **Tuesday, May 7th at 10:30 a.m.**, at the Cathedral of St. John the Baptist. This Mass is to honor and recognize the sacrifice of our police and to remember those who have given their lives in service to their communities. All are invited to attend.

MAY'S BOOK DISCUSSION - The month of May is dedicated to Our Blessed Mother. In her honor our book discussion in May will focus on Brant Pitre's latest book *Jesus and the Jewish Roots of Mary*. If you have attended our previous discussions on Pitre's books, you know his style is an easy read on serious topics. We will meet on **Thursday, May 16th** to discuss chapters 1 – 4 and on **Thursday, May 23rd** to discuss chapters 5 – 8. THE DIOCESAN MAY CROWNING – to honor the Mother of God, will be held on **Sunday, May 19th** at the Cathedral of St. John the Baptist, at 3:30 p.m. All are invited. Parking will be available in the county lot.

ST. ATHANASIUS – Feast day is **May 2nd**. Born in Alexandria Egypt and attended the Council of Nicaea (325) as the Bishop's secretary. He is well known for his defense of the Catholic faith especially the teaching on the divinity of Christ. He was exiled and endured persecution by many non-Christian emperors. He wrote about the Incarnation and introduced Monasticism to the West. He died in 373.

BLESSED DAMIEN JOSEPH DE VEUSTER – (Priest 1840-1889) – **Feast day Friday, May 10th** He was born in Belgium, at 19 he entered the Picpus Fathers. Sent to the Hawaiian Islands and ordained (1864), he served as a parish priest before volunteering as chaplain for the leper colony on the island of Molokai (1873) where he spent the rest of his life working to improve the living conditions of the lepers. He eventually contracted leprosy and died there. Beatified in 1995, he is also honored by Hawaii with a statue in the US Capitol.

NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER – was celebrated on **Thursday, May 2nd**. It was created in 1952 by a joint resolution of Congress and signed into law by President Harry S. Truman. The law was unanimously amended by both the House and the Senate and signed into law by President Ronald Reagan on May 5, 1988 designating the first Thursday of May as a day of national prayer.
