WHAT IS PENTECOST? Pentecost is the Solemnity on which we commemorate the coming of the Holy Spirit on the early followers of Jesus. Before the events of the first Pentecost, which came fifty days after Jesus’ death and resurrection, there were followers of Jesus, but no formal movement that could be meaningfully called “the church.” Thus, from an historical point of view, Pentecost can be viewed as the day on which the church began. The Holy Spirit provides seven gifts, Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Courage, Knowledge, Reverence, and Fear of the Lord. These gifts make us part of the Body of Christ and then enables us to strengthen that Body and the whole world by the way we live.

CORPUS CHRISTI – **Sunday, June 23rd** – Also known as the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is a Feast Day that dates to 1264. Two stories surround the promulgation of this Feast Day by Pope Urban IV: Fr. Peter of Prague witnessed a Eucharistic miracle where by the Sacred Species, through transubstantiation, actually bleed onto the corporal. Upon hearing of this miracle, Pope Urban IV instituted the Feast Day for the Universal Church. The corporal, now known as the Corporal of Bolsena is kept in a reliquary at the Duomo di Orvieto in Orvieto Italy. Check back next week for the second story.

This year, following the **12:00p.m, Mass**, we have decided to re-institute the venerable practice of processing with our Lord around the Church grounds and offer benediction at three outdoor altars. All are welcome to attend, please invite your friends and family.
