ST. THOMAS, APOSTLE – feast day is **Wednesday, July 3**. We know nothing certain about the subsequent ministry of St. Thomas. Tradition tells us that he preached in Parthia and a far east as India, and that he was martyred near present day Madras. Pope Paul VI declared him Patron of India in 1972. Doubts we may have as St. Thomas did, but these only remind us that we have not exhausted the mystery of God. Pope St. Gregory the Great said: “The disbelief of Thomas has done more for our faith than the faith of the other disciples. As he touches Christ and is won over to belief, every doubt is cast aside, and our faith is strengthened.”
