ST. CAMILLUS DE LELLIS, PRIEST – **Feast day Sunday, July 14** – After a rather inauspicious youth-he was an unloved, neglected child, addicted to gambling, in ill health and quarrelsome. Camillus (1550-1614) was moved to change his life and attitude after hearing a sermon at the Capuchin friary at Manfredonia, Italy. He subsequently made efforts to join the Capuchins, but was twice refused because of ill health. He then decided to devote himself to the care of the sick. On the advice of St. Philip Neri he became a priest at age 34, and shortly thereafter founded a religious order whose primary purpose is to care for the sick.
