FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR

Dear Parishioners,

With November coming up, we as a Church especially remember to pray for all of our beloved faithful departed. One of the traditions at Holy Angels over the years has been to have a Novena of Masses (9 days of Masses) offered for our beloved dead. Many of you submit the names of your loved ones and they are remembered in these Masses for 9 straight days. This will continue this year.

In addition to the 9 days of Masses, the names you submit for this Novena of Masses will also be offered on a monthly basis beginning in January and lasting until October. All in all, there will be 19 Masses offered for your loved ones instead of the usual 9!

Beginning in November 2019, however, we will transition away from doing the All Souls Novena and instead keep a monthly Mass for All Souls instead. So, instead of the usual 9 Masses that you have all been used to for your loved ones, you will have 12!

The reason I would like to transition to this model is because each year there have been a few Masses in the Novena of Masses that were said at other churches instead of Holy Angels. Since there's not a daily Mass at Holy Angels every day of the week, we had to have other parishes take the Masses to complete the Novena. With the newer model, we will have more Masses for our beloved dead and they will all be at Holy Angels. The monthly Masses for our beloved faithful departed will be on the first Tuesday of every month starting in January.
