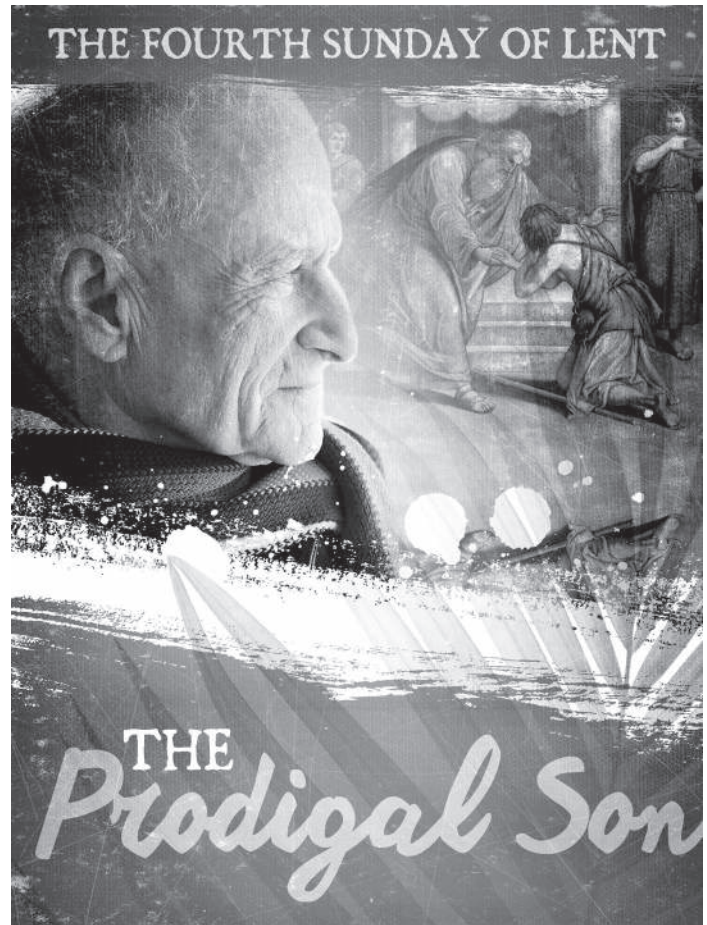

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP -

RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

I read an article in "Esquire" magazine about graciousness. The article began, "Graciousness looks easy, but of course it is not. Do not mistake mere manners for graciousness. Manners are rules. Helpful, yes. But graciousness reflects a state of being; it emanates from your inventory of self" (Chiarella, Tom. "How to be Gracious and Why," May 2013). I think that all mature disciples of Jesus

Christ should reflect a high level of graciousness in their life. It lends evidence to the joy of the Lord that resides in their heart and the grace that fills their being.

Being gracious is a characteristic of an Everyday Steward. Even in the ordinary circumstances of the day, good stewards display a giving demeanor that makes others take notice. Graciousness really makes a difference when it is displayed instead of anger, resentment, or ridicule. No story explains this more powerfully than the parable of the prodigal son.

In Jesus' parable, the father has every reason to share with his son his hurt and dissatisfaction upon his returning home after he wasted his inheritance and disgraced his family. Instead, his gracious response is overwhelming, so much so that the other son who has remained faithful becomes disgruntled. A gracious steward gives without asking why or care for the cost. And with grace comes mercy, not human justice. With true justice, we would all suffer. But with mercy, comes love and the chance to begin again.

By developing graciousness in our lives, we become instruments of grace for the world around us. We provide glimpses of heaven and the love of the Father for his sons and daughters. And the feasts we prepare for those here on earth give them a taste of the heavenly banquet that awaits when we finally come home.

4th Sunday of Lent: 2nd Scrutiny

"Jesus answered, 'Neither he nor his parents sinned; it is so that the works of God might be made visible through him.'" At this point, Jesus' disciples were still subject to the prevailing idea that physical disabilities were a punishment for sin. When they saw the man blind from birth, they simply assumed his lack of sight was the result of sin; they only wondered whose sin was responsible. But Jesus cast the entire question in another light. By telling his disciples that sin wasn't at work here, but that God was at work, Jesus must have shocked his hearers. How could God's work be made visible through a blind man?

It didn't take long to find out. Jesus used the opportunity to work a miracle. He anointed the man with mud, sent him to wash, and the man "came back able to see." This healing of course became a testament to the power of Christ, for those who were willing to see it.

As we face trials and tribulations in our lives, we also face the challenge of seeing how "the works of God might be made visible" through them. Understanding that God's love and care are still at work even in the most troublesome situations of life is a challenge to be sure. It requires a kind of spiritual vision that comes with purity of heart. In other words, the more we overcome the blindness caused by our sins, the more we are able to truly "see" the way things are and the way God works.

Jesus tells us today, "I came into this world for judgment, so that those who do not see might see, and those who do see might become blind." Thus we receive the same warning the Lord gave to the self-righteous Pharisees: we must humbly acknowledge our sins in order to clearly behold the way God is working in our lives.

"His son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son.' But his father ordered his servants, 'let us celebrate with a feast because this son of mine was dead, and has come to life again.'" - Lk 15:21-22a, 23b-24

“... Salió entonces el padre y le rogó que entrara; pero él replicó: “¡Hace tanto tiempo que te sirvo, sin desobedecer jamás una orden tuya, y tú no me has dado nunca ni un cabrito para comérmelo con mis amigos! Pero eso sí, viene ese hijo tuyo, que despilfarró tus bienes con malas mujeres, y tú mandas matar el becerro gordo”. El padre repuso: “Hijo, tú siempre estás conmigo y todo lo mío es tuyo. Pero era necesario hacer fiesta y regocijarnos, porque este hermano tuyo estaba muerto y ha vuelto a la vida, estaba perdido y lo hemos encontrado.”” (Lc 15, 1-3. 11-32)

Este texto de Lucas es el dibujo luminoso del rostro de Dios, así Jesús lo reveló: un Dios del amor y del perdón. Que acoge al pecador arrepenido reconduciéndolo a la plenitud de su dignidad, un Dios desilusionado de los hijos obtusos y sórdidos pero siempre dispuesto a esperar una conversión. Esta parábola nos muestra la relación que tenemos con Dios.
