On Tuesday 15th August, at the SCIAF office, 19 Park Circus, a Mass to celebrate the Feast of the Assumption will take place at 12.30pm. The Mass will be celebrated by Bishop Joseph Toal, Bishop President of SCIAF. At the conclusion of the Mass, SCIAF will formally adopt Blessed Oscar Romero as patron in addition to our existing patron, Saint Margaret of Scotland. Mass will be held in the Board Room which will, in future, be known as the 'Oscar Romero Room'. On Wednesday 16th August you are invited to the Scottish premier screening of the film/documentary 'The Claim—Archbishop Romero, his people and Pope Francis.'
