We are most alarmed that this trivialises abortion, further cheapens human life and puts women at risk. SPUC has taken major actions to try and stop this.

Last year, in 2018, we decided to take legal action to stop this damaging and reckless policy. The generous contributions from our supporters have made this possible. Unfortunately, just before Christmas, we heard that we had lost the first stage of this case and that the Court of Session viewed woman's home as an appropriate place for abortion. In March 2019 we launched an official Appeal against this decision. Sadly, we learned a fortnight ago, that our court battle was lost, and we are now facing the prospect of going to the Supreme Court and taking on all the demands that such a path entails.

The 2018 abortion statistics for Scotland have just been released and highlighted how damaging the new policy has been. The statistics have shown a corresponding huge jump in the number of abortions—an extra 1000 in Scotland just last year (an increase of 8.9%). Having worked with politicians across the political divide, I can tell you that many (even those who are pro-abortion) are shocked and saddened by the introduction of home abortion.

IN REMEMBRANCE

At every Mass, we pray for our deceased relatives and friends but, in keeping with Catholic tradition, November is a month specifically dedicated to praying for the Holy Souls. On or near the Feast of All Souls, a special *Mass of Remembrance* is celebrated in our parish for all our deceased loved ones. As a Parish community, we now hope to commemorate our deceased parishioners in two very special and everlasting ways:

Firstly, we think it fitting to establish a dedicated *Altar of Remembrance* on which a *Parish Memorial Book* will be placed as a perpetual reminder of all our deceased parishioners.

Secondly, we also wish to provide families and friends of our deceased parishioners - and benefactors - the option to dedicate individual/family *Memorial Plaques* which will be permanently mounted on the walls around this Altar.

A “*Memorial Plaque*” brochure, available after Mass in the sacristy, contains more details of these plans. We hope you share our view that these plans provide a befitting memorial to our deceased loved ones and that you will support our endeavours.

VIDES UK SUMMER CAMP

VIDES UK will be returning to St Peter’s Parish, Glenburn, Paisley, this summer for the 3rd year of their five year project. The Summer Camp will take place from Monday 29th July – Saturday 3rd August 2019. The team of young volunteers are very excited to be returning to Paisley and are busy planning some fabulous activities for the children and teenagers to enjoy.

VIDES UK is part of an International Voluntary Organisation founded in 1987 by the Salesian Sisters with and for young people. They offer young people aged 17+ the opportunity to volunteer, making a difference in the lives of children and young people, here in the UK, and all over the world. The volunteers receive training and opportunities for Personal Development as well as an ongoing structured support programme, during and after VIDES UK projects.

VIDES UK responds to the needs of local communities collaborating in the development of an ongoing service for the young that will be a positive influence for all. They believe in and see the potential in every individual and set out to empower them to be true to themselves.

VIDES UK volunteers plan, prepare and deliver a variety of activities, experiences and projects for children and young people aged 8-16 which encourages them to reach their full potential and to become protagonists in building a better world. The Summer Camp provided by VIDES UK is a **non-denominational project for children (P4-P7) and teenagers (1st-4th Year) in the Glenburn and Foxbar area**. To launch the project, VIDES UK invite young people and their families to a family social evening on Sunday 28th July from 6-8pm at St Peter’s, Braehead Road, Glenburn, where they will get the opportunity to meet the volunteers and to sign up for this year’s camp. All who attend will get to take part in different games and activities, enjoy a BBQ and learn more about the types of activities the children and young people will be taking part in throughout the week. There is no charge for this event and children of all ages are welcome to attend with a parent/guardian. We would love to see as many of you there as possible. Those who are unable to come along can still register on Monday 29th July at 10.30am.
