IN REMEMBRANCE

At every Mass, we pray for our deceased relatives and friends but, in keeping with Catholic tradition, November is a month specifically dedicated to praying for the Holy Souls. On or near the Feast of All Souls, a special *Mass of Remembrance* is celebrated in our parish for all our deceased loved ones. As a Parish community, we now hope to commemorate our deceased parishioners in two very special and everlasting ways:

Firstly, we think it fitting to establish a dedicated *Altar of Remembrance* on which a *Parish Memorial Book* will be placed as a perpetual reminder of all our deceased parishioners.

Secondly, we also wish to provide families and friends of our deceased parishioners - and benefactors - the option to dedicate individual/family *Memorial Plaques* which will be permanently mounted on the walls around this Altar.

A "*Memorial Plaque*" brochure, available after Mass in the sacristy, contains more details of these plans. We hope you share our view that these plans provide a befitting memorial to our deceased loved ones and that you will support our endeavours.

St Therese of Lisieux in Paisley Diocese next weekend

The relics of Saint Therese arrive in our Diocese next weekend! You may have seen their arrival in Carfin where 5,000 attended the Pilgrim Mass and over 10,000 visited the relics with their personal prayers and petitions over the weekend. Now it is our turn to receive Saint Therese and many blessings for ourselves and our loved ones, our priests, parishes and diocese. Do make sure to make your own personal visit to this Saint, the Little Flower, whose powerful intercession for ordinary folk is so well known. Here is her itinerary: **Saturday 14th September:** 5.30pm Reception and Vigil Mass St Mary's, Greenock with Bishop John, followed by private and parish visits. **Sunday 15th September** 12am-5am- All-night Vigil, 9.30am Mass and departure for St Mirin's Cathedral. 12noon Mass at Cathedral with Bishop John. Polish Mass 2.30pm. 5.00pm Evening Prayer and Benediction. Parish and private visits between liturgies. **Monday 16th September** 12am-6am: All-night Vigil followed by masses. Mass at 12noon with Bishop John - open to all, followed by our farewell to the relics. See leaflets and Paisley Diocese website for more details. Both churches will be open at all times while the relics are present.
