### FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR:

Today is the Nineteenth (19th) Sunday in Ordinary Time. If we wait to be adrift upon a stormy sea in order to see that God is present with us, we will miss out on the grace and goodness that currently surrounds us. Over a month has passed since we reopened for public Masses [Sunday and weekday] for those who feel safe to come. We are seeing a gradual increase in attendance. At this point we are nearing our total seating capacity under the current restrictions. Please be ready to be turned away if we reach seating capacity before Mass time start. Again, we will do our best to accommodate as many people as possible. However, with social/physical distancing in place, our capacity is greatly limited at this time. Reservations are not required, yet encouraged. Thank you to those who have used our reservation system. \*Again, if we have any spikes in COVID cases in our communities, we will need to close our buildings to public Masses and private prayer. The churches will remain locked except for half hour before Mass times and private prayer times. Saturday evening and daily Masses at Cherokee will be live streamed on our website.

And thank you for all parishioners who continue to mail in their parish contributions and/or go online to do this.

**Cherokee Regional Medical Center Hospice** is offering a five-week grief support group. **Living with Loss** is free of charge and welcomes anyone who has experienced a loss through death of a loved one. It is recommended, but not required, that the death as occurred three months prior to attendance. The format combines grief education with peer support within a small-group atmosphere. If you are aware of anyone that could benefit from this service, please have him or her contact CRMC Hospice at 712-225-6459 for more information or to pre-register. We will meet each Wednesday, August 5<sup>th</sup> through September 2<sup>nd</sup> from 3:30-4:30 p.m. at the CRMC Hospice office located at 1000 S. 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, Cherokee. This group will be tailored to address grief and the COVID 19 pandemic. Class size will be limited to the first six people to sign up. Health screening, social distancing and face masks will be

required. We will provide a face mask if you do not have one. We will also be offering this grief support group in virtual format. This will be offered through Google Meet. An e-mail address and device with a camera will be needed to join by video. There is also the option to call in via telephone with the number and pin from the invitation. This group will be limited to the first ten people that register. Virtual grief support will be offered each Thursday, August 6<sup>th</sup> through September 3<sup>rd</sup> from 7:30-8:30 p.m.
