Lent: Jesus' temptation reveals the way in which the Son of God is Messiah, contrary to the way Satan proposes to him and the way men wish to attribute to him. This is why Christ vanquished the Tempter for us: "For we have not a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sinning." By the solemn forty days of Lent the Church unites herself each year to the mystery of Jesus in the desert. [CCC 540]

Why does the Priest and Deacon kiss the altar and the Book of Scriptures (after he reads the Gospel)? - In our Catholic rituals, the kiss is a sign of reverence that is shown toward something that is considered holy or sacred. The first thing a priest and deacon does when he comes into the church to begin Mass is to reverence the altar with a kiss. At the end of Mass he does the same. This reverence is shown to the altar because it is a symbol of Christ and because it is the table on which the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is offered. In similar fashion, the book containing the Gospels is kissed by the priest

(or deacon) as a sign of respect and reverence for the Word of God that it contains. It might be helpful to remember also that the "Sign of Peace" we exchange with one another before receiving Holy Communion [which is suspended at this time] was once called the "Kiss of Peace," since it is another example of how we show respect and reverence for something we consider sacred: one another!

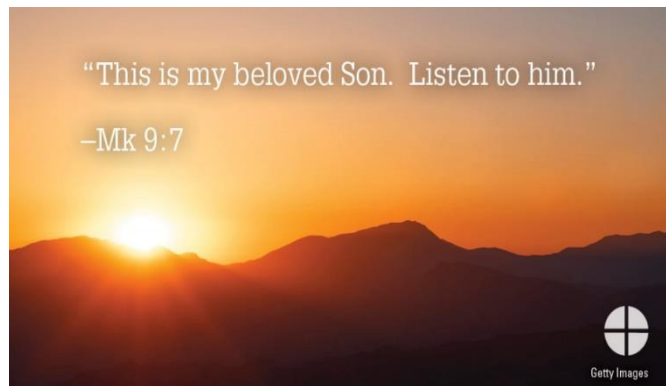
