
SUNDAY, AUGUST 13, 2017-NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME MAKING AN IMPACT ON OUR CHILDREN – THE POWER OF PARENTING

Caring adults shake our heads sometimes, wondering how we can help our children stay away from destructive and wrong behavior. One good response, The National Center on Addiction and Substance Abuse at Columbia University in New York tells us, is right under our noses. They tell us, "Whether you're cooking a gourmet meal or ordering food from your favorite take-out place, rest assured that what your kids really want at the dinner table is YOU! Family meals are the perfect time to talk to your kids and to listen to what's on their minds".

Columbia's 10 years of research finds this: "The more often children and teens eat dinner with their families, the less likely they are to smoke, drink or use drugs. Compared to kids who have fewer than three family dinners a week, children and teens who have frequent family dinners are:

- ➤ At 70 percent lower risk for substance abuse.
- ➤ Half as likely to try cigarettes.
- ➤ Half as likely to be daily cigarette smokers.
- ➤ Half as likely to try marijuana.
- ➤ One third less likely to try alcohol.
- ➤ Half as likely to get drunk monthly.
- More likely to get better grades in school.
- Less likely to have friends who drink alcohol and use marijuana.
- More likely to have parents who take responsibility for teen drug use.
- Almost 40 percent likelier to say future drug use will never happen.


FEAST OF THE ASSUMPTION – AUGUST 15TH

This weekend our new narthex tile floor is complete. The tile is a new, more slip resistant product. The inside narthex doors will be reinstalled this week. We hope you are pleased with the results.

This past Thursday we began re-sealing and re-grouting our decorative stone front church entrance. This work is necessary to keep the stones securely in place and to stop damaging water seepage behind the stones.

Next week we are repaying the oldest and most degraded portion of our main parking lot in front of the church. This is the biggest remaining project that we committed to as a parish for the money we would receive back each year from the diocese as a 25% rebate on all the contributions that we parishioners pledged to the Bishop's "Partners In Faith" 5 year capital campaign that began in 2013.

Many parishioners, myself included, are still making our pledge payments on the 5 year pledges we made in 2013. Many families, too, have completed your pledge contributions to the "**Partners in Faith**" campaign. The diocese has been sending us our 25% rebates each year (This year we received \$42,485.89.) so that our parish can work on the 5 projects we committed to in 2013.

We thank all of you who have completed your pledge payments, and we say thank you as well to those of us still contributing towards our 2013 pledges. Many "Partners in Faith" contributors have also very generously responded to our *Moving Forward-Growing Stronger Together* appeal in this spring. Your great generosity to "Partners in Faith" with the diocese, and your generous increased weekly contributions in response to *Moving Forward-Growing Stronger Together* are giving us the resources - and the confidence - that enable us to make these very important repairs and improvements this summer for everyone's safety and convenience. We also acknowledge very generous donations made especially for the narthex floor replacement project.

May God continue blessing everyone for your generosity to our parish and our diocese. And everyone, please keep praying for our parish and our diocese.

Mensaje del párroco:

Impactando a nuestros niños – El poder de ser padres

Los adultos que se preocupan nos sacuden la cabeza a veces, preguntándonos cómo podemos ayudar a nuestros niños a mantenerse lejos de un comportamiento destructivo e incorrecto. Una buena respuesta es, el Centro Nacional de Adicción y Abuso de Sustancias de la Universidad de Columbia en Nueva York nos dice que tenemos la buena respuesta justo en nuestras narices. Ellos nos dicen: "Ya sea que usted esté cocinando una cena gourmet, o pidiéndo comida de su lugar favorito para llevar a la casa, puede estar seguro de que lo que realmente quieren sus hijos en la mesa es a USTED! Las COMIDAS EN FAMILIA son el momento perfecto para hablar con sus hijos y escuchar lo que está en sus mentes".

En los 10 años de investigación, la Universidad de Columbia encuentra lo siguiente: "Cuanto más frecuente los niños y adolescentes cenen con sus familias, menos probabilidades hay de que fumen, beban o usen drogas. En comparación con los niños que tienen menos de tres cenas familiares por semana, los niños y adolescentes que tienen cenas en familia frecuentes son:



- 70 porciento en menos riesgo de utilizar sustancias peligrosas,
- la mitad menos probable de que traten los cigarillos,
- la mitad menos probable de que sean fumadores diarios,
- la mitad menos probable de que utilicen marijuana,
- un tercio menos probable de que traten el alcohol,
- la mitad menos probable de que se emborrachen mensualmente.
 - más probable de que saquen buenas calificaciones en la escuela,
 - menos probable de que tengan amigos que consuman alcohol y

marijuana,

- más probable de que tengan padres que asumen su responsabilidad cuando algún adolescente utilice las drogas,
- > casi 40 porciento más probable de que diga que nunca utilizará drogas en un futuro.

Así que su familia cenando juntos – que simple - que básico - pero significa pasar un buen TIEMPO juntos. ¿Puede usted hacer ésto? ¿Puede usted permitirse no hacerlo?
