Bob Iracane joins our faithful, long time Trustee, Mrs. Barbara Ryan as one of the 2 Lay Trustees of the parish corporation.

AUGUST REPAIR PROJECT REPORT

ALL YOUR GENEROSITY MAKES THIS HAPPEN

THANK YOU

Our Narthex tile project is complete. The porcelain tile is a new slip resistant product for our greater safety. We acknowledge very generous donations contributed specifically for this Narthex floor replacement. We hope you are pleased with the results of this effort.

We have now completely resealed and re-grouted our beautiful decorative stone front church entrance. This work is necessary to keep all the stones securely in place and to stop any damaging water seepage behind the stones. This work must be done every 3 or 4 years.

We are finally now repairing the most degraded portion of our main parking lot in front of the church. This is the largest project still needing to be done from the list of 5 parish projects that we committed to do as part of the Bishop’s 2013 “Partners in Faith” capital campaign. (Our other 4 “Partners in Faith” projects: (1) The entire outside church walls replacement (all done); (2) Replacing the lighting in the church with brighter LED, money saving light fixtures (all done); (3) Replacing the 20 year old parish truck (all done); (4) Repairs in the Rectory (staff front office area upgraded – everything else not done yet).

Many parishioners, including me, are still making our pledge payments on the 5 year pledges we made in 2013. Also, many families have completed your campaign pledge contributions. The Diocese has been sending us our 25% campaign rebates each year (\$42,484.83 this year) so that we can do all these projects. We will get another rebate in 2018. We thank everyone who have completed your pledges, and we thank everyone still making contribution payments on our 2013 pledges.

Many “Partners in Faith” contributors, as well as so many other parishioners are now generously responding to our own Moving Forward – Growing Stronger Together parish appeal from this spring. Your blessed generosity in “Partners in Faith” and every one’s kind increased weekly collection contributions in Moving Forward – Growing Stronger Together are providing us with the financial resources enabling us to confidently make the very important repairs and improvements we are making this summer for everyone’s safety and convenience.

We ask God to continue blessing everyone for our outstanding generosity to our parish and our diocese. And please, everyone in our parish keep praying for our parish and our diocese.

Mensaje del párroco:

Impactando a nuestros niños – El poder de ser padres

Los adultos que se preocupan nos sacuden la cabeza a veces, preguntándonos cómo podemos ayudar a nuestros niños a mantenerse lejos de un comportamiento destructivo e incorrecto. Una buena respuesta es, el Centro Nacional de Adicción y Abuso de Sustancias de la Universidad de Columbia en Nueva York nos dice que tenemos la buena respuesta justo en nuestras narices. Ellos nos dicen: "Ya sea que usted esté cocinando una cena gourmet, o pidiendo comida de su lugar favorito para llevar a la casa, puede estar seguro de que lo que realmente quieren sus hijos en la mesa es a USTED! Las COMIDAS EN FAMILIA son el momento perfecto para hablar con sus hijos y escuchar lo que está en sus mentes".

En los 10 años de investigación, la Universidad de Columbia encuentra lo siguiente: "Cuanto más frecuente los niños y adolescentes cenaron con sus familias, menos probabilidades hay de que fumen, beban o usen drogas. En comparación con los niños que tienen menos de tres cenas familiares por semana, los niños y adolescentes que tienen cenas en familia frecuentes son:



- 70 por ciento en menos riesgo de utilizar sustancias peligrosas,
- la mitad menos probable de que traten los cigarillos,
- la mitad menos probable de que sean fumadores diarios,
- la mitad menos probable de que utilicen marijuana,
- un tercio menos probable de que traten el alcohol,
- la mitad menos probable de que se emborrachen mensualmente,
- más probable de que saquen buenas calificaciones en la escuela,
- menos probable de que tengan amigos que consuman alcohol y marijuana,
- más probable de que tengan padres que asumen su responsabilidad cuando algún adolescente utilice las drogas,
- casi 40 por ciento más probable de que diga que nunca utilizará drogas en un futuro.

Así que su familia cenando juntos – que simple - que básico - pero significa pasar un buen TIEMPO juntos. ¿Puede usted hacer ésto? ¿Puede usted permitirse no hacerlo? Por favor, invierta TIEMPO cenando con sus hijos hoy. Por favor no posponga esto.
