THIS WEEK TUESDAY IS ELECTION DAY AND SATURDAY IS VETERANS' DAY

This Tuesday is very important. It is Election Day. All of us have a responsibility to participate in the election by voting according to our conscientious judgment of what is best for our country and our local communities. Many people sadly ignore elections where we choose our leaders and decide important ballot questions. We can take the election for granted. We can take our freedom for granted, too. How ironic this is when we celebrate Veteran's Day only a few days later. On that great day we honor the men and women who risk their lives to protect our way of life – to protect our freedom, including our right to vote in free elections. I hope that reflecting on the personal cost that our Veterans have paid in their lives so that we can keep our freedoms and the right to vote will inspire us to respond gratefully to them by voting on Tuesday. Please realize just how blessed we are to have free elections and please vote on Tuesday. Do it for our country! Do it for our Veterans, too!

This Saturday, November 11th, is Veterans' Day. We remember the men and women who have defended our country and our free way of life. Right now around the world the men and women of our military services are on duty protecting us, putting their lives on the line. Members of our military services are dying and being seriously injured in Afghanistan and now again in Iraq and in West Africa. Our armed services and National Guard also perform heroically here at home and around the world in hurricanes, fires and earthquakes, risking their lives to save people from injury or death. **Program at Veteran's Memorial Park at 11 AM Saturday.**

These brave guardians of our way of life all have families. Like all of us they are children, brothers and sisters, spouses, cousins and friends. We must pray for them every day. We must honor them. We must give them the very best equipment, leadership and benefits that our country is able to provide for them. And when they return home they must receive the best medical care for the rest of their lives. We owe them every penny of that in respect for their heroic service. To do less would make our Veteran's Day celebrations hollow. To do all we can shows our gratitude and solidarity with our Veterans as well as our men and women on active duty at this dangerous time. Pray for our soldiers in Afghanistan, Iraq, West Africa, Korea and around the world! Pray that they will come home soon. If you know a veteran or someone now on active duty, please pray this week for them by name, call them, send them a letter or an e-mail thanking them for their service. Also let their families know how much you are personally grateful for the sacrifices they are making now or in the past.

Please vote on Tuesday as a tribute to our Veterans and active duty service men and women who protect all our rights including, this week, **THE RIGHT TO VOTE ON TUESDAY.**

OUR PARISH FINANCE COMMITTEE’S WORK-

THANK YOU

Last weekend at Mass our Parish Finance Committee members presented the parish’s July 1, 2016 to June 30, 2017 financial statement. I thank the members for their guidance and foresight in helping me to fulfill my administrative responsibility, as your pastor, to make sure the parish is on solid financial footing and at the same time meeting all obligations to our employees and to everyone who comes here expecting good service from the parish in a safe and helpful environment.

The Financial Report shows a \$35,740 deficit for the year. One big reason is that some major improvements listed in the Bulletin report were necessary but unanticipated. And already since the present fiscal year began only on July 1, we have spent \$92,018 for necessary repairs and improvements most of which we have been thanking you for several weeks in the Bulletin. The new Narthex floor cost \$19,423. Repairing the stone front of the church was \$8,250 and the parking lot repairs were \$59,960. Lately, a water heater in the convent (\$1,745) and skylight repairs in the parish center (\$2,640) making a total of \$92,018 since July 1. We have been blessed with substantial donations to help pay some of these big expenses and our **Partners In Faith** grants from the Diocese also are helping a lot.

But it is your generosity week after week and the Finance Committee’s expert supervision that make it possible to take care of necessary improvements and repairs and still maintain our parish’s financial integrity. I complement our Parish Finance Committee and thank them in your name for steering the ship when the sea sometimes get rough. Gratefully, Father Herb

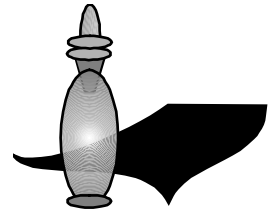

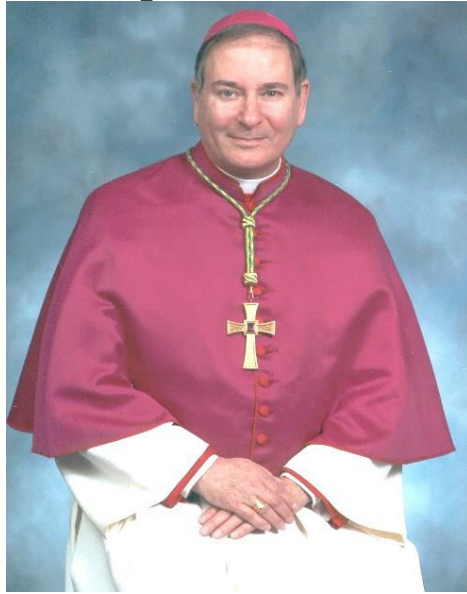
