Re: **Revised Liturgical Guidelines to Address the Massive Outbreak of Flu in our Country**

This flu season is one of the worst in 15 years. Bishop Serratelli has issued the following guidelines for all liturgies in the diocese until further notice:

2018 Liturgical Guidelines for the Flu Season

A widespread outbreak of flu requires precautions that lessen its transmission. Nothing can absolutely prevent spread of the flu virus but a few common sense recommendations can help to lessen the possibility.

The following information may be included in bulletin announcements and pulpit announcements:

If you don't feel well and suspect that you may have the flu: **remain at home.**

Wash your hands frequently with soap and water or an alcohol based hand cleanser.

Sign of Peace: If you feel uncomfortable with exchange of the sign of peace through a handshake you are under no obligation to do so. You may extend the sign of peace to your neighbors by a nod of the head.

Distributing and Receiving the Eucharist: Priests, deacons, and extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist **must thoroughly wash their hands with soap and water or an alcohol based hand cleanser both before and after the distribution of the Eucharist.** Receiving Holy Communion in the hand is the most practical means to distribute the Blessed Eucharist in a sanitary way.

Receiving the Eucharist by also drinking the Precious Blood from the chalice is discontinued until the level of flu cases is dramatically decreased.

Children. In parishes where Children's Liturgy of the Word is celebrated, the pastor may suspend the practice during flu season.

PRO LIFE – WE ARE CALLED TO BE “WATCHMEN”

Since Roe v Wade, 60 million babies – created in the image of God – have been silently put to death before they were even born. There was no cry for help, there was no public outrage, and no trumpet sounded to warn the women who felt like abortion was their only option. As Christians, we are called to be the “watchmen.” “But if the watchman sees the sword coming and does not blow the trumpet to warn the people and the sword comes and takes the life of one of them, that man will be taken away because of his sin, but I will hold the watchman accountable for his blood.” (Eze:33:6)

Not everyone is equipped to counsel women in the delicate situation of “an unplanned pregnancy”. But we can all do something. This is the human rights issue of our time. We cannot plead ignorance or remain apathetic.

“So whoever knows the right thing to do and fails to do it, for him it is sin.” (James 4:17) As Christians, we cannot and should not sit idly by and accept this massive slaughter of the innocents. We are called to be the “watchmen” of our brothers and sisters who are defenseless, voiceless and by far the most vulnerable in our society.

Esta temporada de gripe es una de las peores en 15 años. El Obispo Serratelli ha emitido las siguientes pautas para todas las liturgias en la diócesis hasta nuevo aviso: Oficina del Obispo, Diócesis de Paterson

2018 Pautas litúrgicas para la temporada de gripe

Un brote generalizado de gripe requiere precauciones que disminuyan su transmisión. Nada puede evitar la propagación del virus de la gripe, pero algunas recomendaciones de sentido común pueden ayudar a disminuir la posibilidad.

La siguiente información se puede incluir en anuncios de boletines y anuncios en el púlpito:

- Si no se siente bien y sospecha que puede tener la gripe, **quédese en casa.**
- **Lávese las manos con frecuencia con agua y jabón o con un limpiador de manos a base de alcohol.**
- **Signo de la paz:** Si no se siente cómodo con el intercambio del signo de la paz mediante un apretón de manos, no tiene la obligación de hacerlo. Puede extender el signo de la paz a sus vecinos con un movimiento de cabeza.
- **Distribuir y recibir la Eucaristía:** Los sacerdotes, diáconos y ministros extraordinarios de la Eucaristía **deben lavarse bien las manos con agua y jabón o con un limpiador de manos a base de alcohol antes y después de la distribución de la Eucaristía.** Recibir la Sagrada Comunión en la mano es el medio más práctico para distribuir la Santísima Eucaristía de manera higiénica. Recibir la Eucaristía al beber también la Preciosa Sangre del cáliz se suspende hasta que el nivel de casos de gripe disminuya drásticamente.
- **Niños.** En las parroquias donde se celebra la Liturgia de la Palabra de los Niños, el pastor puede suspender la práctica durante la temporada de gripe.
