FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER
THE WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS

This Fourth Sunday of Easter weekend is a special celebration that we call Good Shepherd Sunday. Back in 1963, Blessed Pope Paul VI designated this Sunday each year as *The World Day of Prayer for Vocations*. Our parish joins with all the churches in our diocese and with parishes all over the world to ask God's blessings that every one of us may be strengthened in our particular Christian vocation. Every year on this Fourth Sunday of Easter, we proclaim a Gospel reading from the 10th chapter of Saint John's Gospel, when Jesus proclaims, "I am the Good Shepherd." (John 10:11) Please read the complete 10th chapter of Saint John's Gospel this week if you can.

The church honors all Christian vocations today: Marriage, Priesthood, Permanent Diaconate, Single Life, Consecrated Life as a Religious Priest, Brother, Sister and Lay Ministry. Jesus gives His life for us so that we all may experience the fullness of life. We pray to be open to God's call and ready to completely embrace the personal vocation that God wants to give to every one of us as His gift.

If you are thinking about what your own Christian vocation may be for the future, turn to Jesus in prayer about this. If you are seriously wondering whether God may be calling you to the church directly as a priest, deacon or in the consecrated religious life, we invite you to please speak with one of our priests, deacons or Sister Sylvia about this. Also, you might decide to speak with a priest, deacon or sister who you know personally. Speaking with someone already serving in the church may help you a lot to clarify your own thoughts.

Jesus spoke to His first disciples and to all of us about people giving their lives totally to a vocation serving in the Church, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for His harvest." (Matthew 9: 37-38) Please join with me and pray just one Our Father every single day as your personal vocation prayer.

The National Coalition for Church Vocations offers us a beautiful Vocations Prayer which we present to you. Please offer this prayer today on Good Shepherd Sunday. You might also want to cut it out and put it in your prayer book for every day along with our one daily Our Father for vocations that directly serve the church.

Gracious God, with grateful hearts we welcome the presence of Jesus, our Good Shepherd.

We accept the mission of Jesus to bring good news to the world by our baptismal
commitment to gospel living.

Bless us with discerning hearts. May we have the courage to give our lives in
loving service through married life, the single life, the consecrated life and
ordained life.

Inspire men and women to respond generously and embrace the gift of a religious vocation.

We unite our prayers with the whole Church,
with the communion of saints, with Jesus and the Spirit in praise
and thanksgiving now and forever. Amen

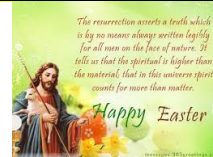

PARTNERS IN FAITH – A SUMMARY PROGRESS REPORT **60% OF PARTNERS IN FAITH CONTRIBUTIONS BEING** **MADE NOW ARE COMING BACK TO OUR PARISH**

Last year, in 2017, our **Partners in Faith** pledge gifts surpassed our total campaign goal of \$905,000. From 2013 to 2017 our parish received back \$226,500, 25% of our contributions as the parish share of our \$905,000 campaign goal. Late in 2017, our parish contributions began to exceed the \$905,000 goal. **Congratulations!** **Thank you very much!**

Because our parish has reached its campaign goal, we now receive a 60% share of every gift that our parishioners are still contributing to **Partners in Faith**. After achieving the goal, our parishioners subsequently contributed \$15,691.79 more to **Partners in Faith** in 2017. Our parish share of this money was \$9,415.07 (60%) through December 31, 2017. This is good news!

So now in 2018 and beyond, our parish is receiving back 60% of everything we contribute to **Partners in Faith**. If you are still making payments on your **Partners in Faith** pledge, thank you for your perseverance. We especially urge you now to please continue making your pledge payments because our parish will receive 60% of your contributions back from the diocese.

Our parish decided on 5 **Partners in Faith** projects for our own parish in 2013. Since then our parish share of **Partners in Faith** has enabled us to completely restore the exterior church walls, our most important building priority, to buy a new parish truck, to pave a large part of our parking lot, to update our church lighting system and upgrade some parish office space in the rectory. Thank you!

We still have more parish **Partners in Faith** projects to accomplish: finish paving our parking lot and upgrade our outside lights and to make repairs in the rectory. Your continuing pledge gifts now are giving us more resources to keep working at and paying for these necessary repairs and improvements.

Thanks again to everyone who has completed your **Partners in Faith** pledge. You have helped our diocese and our parish. Please be faithful to your pledges if you are still working on them. Día mundial de la oración por las vocaciones

Este Cuarto domingo de Pascua, es la celebración especial del Domingo del Buen Pastor. En 1963, el Papa Pablo VI designó el cuarto domingo de Pascua de cada año, como el Día Mundial de la *Oración por las Vocaciones*. Nuestra parroquia se une a la iglesia universal y con todas las parroquias alrededor del mundo, para pedirle a Dios la bendición de que cada uno seamos reforzados en nuestra particular vocación cristiana. Cada año en este Cuarto domingo de Pascua, proclamamos una lectura del décimo capítulo del Evangelio de Juan, cuando Jesús proclama “Yo soy el buen pastor.” (Juan 10, 11) y donde explica el significado de ser el Buen Pastor. Por favor lea esta semana si puede, el capítulo 10 completo del Evangelio de San Juan.

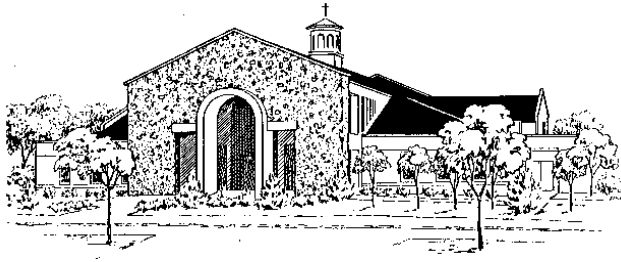
Dios misericordioso, con corazones agradecidos recibimos la presencia de Jesús, nuestro Buen Pastor.
