**THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF JESUS CHRIST**

This weekend we celebrate the great feast of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. At the Holy Thursday Mass of the Lord's Supper, we rejoice in the gifts of the Holy Eucharist which Jesus gave us for the first time at the Last Supper. We also rejoice in the gift of the Sacrament of Holy Orders at the Holy Thursday Mass where Jesus told his disciples "Do this In Remembrance of Me" thus empowering them to celebrate Mass and be His priests, bringing the gift of His Body and Blood to the Altar at Mass. This awesome gift which Jesus gives us, the gift of receiving Him in His Body and Blood, His Soul and Divinity in the Holy Eucharist is an extraordinary blessing is only be explained by realizing that this is the greatest sign of how much He loves us and just how close He wants to be to us, becoming our very food and drink, our physical and spiritual nourishment in Holy Communion.

Rejoicing in this Eucharistic gift again, beyond Holy Thursday, is the reason this feast of Corpus Christi developed in the liturgical life of the Church. How beautiful that we have this great feast to thank Jesus for the gift of His Living Body and Blood. We rejoice today for the Holy Eucharist which is given to us in every Mass celebrated all across the world.

**RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION REVERENTLY**

We come to Mass preparing to be nourished by the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ in Holy Communion. We should examine ourselves today on Corpus Christi to be sure that we are always coming to Holy Communion with a spirit of great reverence and gratitude for the wondrous gift we are receiving – the Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ Himself. Christ's real presence in the Holy Eucharist is the greatest gift we receive in this life and we must never be indifferent about receiving Jesus in Holy Communion because we do it very often.

We ask ourselves how reverent are our internal attitude and our bodily posture as we approach Holy Communion. We are walking up in communion with the parish community to be nourished by the Body and Blood of Our Savior who died for our sins. We should be alert and reverent. Folding our hands in prayer will help prepare us to receive Jesus. We bow our head slightly before we receive Jesus. We carefully hold our hands up in front of our chest as a throne for Jesus when we receive Holy Communion in our hand. If we choose not to receive the Precious Blood from the cup, we should pause and reverently bow our head slightly as we pass the Eucharistic Minister holding the chalice. Our physical movements at Communion time in the Mass should always remind us that a great event is taking place each time Jesus comes into our bodies to nourish our spirit. We thank Jesus for coming to us in the Holy Eucharist, and we always receive Him with great joy and physical reverence.

## TEN SIGNS OF A SAFE PROGRAM FOR CHILDREN & YOUTH

1. Screening of staff / volunteers.
2. Adults trained in safe environment strategies and signs of abuse.
3. **Code of conduct enforced.**
4. **Open Communication between parents and staff / staff and children / children and parents.**
5. **Parents always Welcome.**
6. Children educated in right relationships & what to do if a relationship is not right.
7. **All children treated with Dignity and Respect.**
8. *Clear Rules and Expectations, consistent reinforcement / consequences.*
9. Adequate supervision of youth. Team approach – accountability – no 1:1 isolation.
10. **All abuse is reported.**
