The Unique POWER of Eucharistic Adoration

What is this unique power of Eucharistic Adoration? The unique power is that Jesus is gazing at us and we are gazing at Him— in person. This uniqueness is presented in a new light in a book that is rapidly gaining popularity among the faithful.

This new perspective comes in the form of a diary, IN SINU JESU (On the Heart of Jesus), by an anonymous American Benedictine monk. (Imprimatur 2016) The diary records words spoken to this monk by Jesus and Mary between 2007 and 2016.


These words of Jesus are a call to His priests to spend time before His Eucharistic Face so that all their works proceed from their Adoration. In this diary, Jesus is also calling the laity to pray for their priests through adoration of the Eucharist.

The fact that this book is being translated into languages all over the world is evidence that this is a major work of the Holy Spirit. Furthermore, the publisher stated that one bishop has ordered 500 copies to give to all his priests, and a non-profit has ordered 5,000 copies to distribute at no cost.

In the following excerpt, Jesus is teaching us how to adore Him.

“The practice of adoration is not difficult. It is a gentle abiding in My presence, a resting in the radiance of My Eucharistic Face, a closeness to My Eucharistic Heart. Words, though sometimes helpful, are not necessary, nor are thoughts. What I seek from one who would adore Me in spirit and in truth is a heart aflame with love, a heart content to abide in My presence, silent and still, engaged only in the act of loving Me and of receiving My love. Though this is not difficult, it is, all the same, My own gift to the soul who asks for it. Ask, then, for the gift of adoration.”

ITALY, 1656 Eucharistic Miracle of Cava dei Tirreni

At Naples, in May of 1656, a terrible epidemic of the Plague was spreading as a result of an invasion by Spanish soldiers who had come from Sardinia. The epidemic spread among the villages and the surrounding countryside quite rapidly, arriving also at the small town of Cava dei Tirreni. There were thousands of victims in the city as well as the countryside. Father Paolo Franco, one of the few spared from the plague, inspired from on high, and challenging every danger, called

the people together and ordered a procession of reparation to Mount Castello, located at a distance of a few kilometers. When they reached the top of the mountain, Father Franco blessed Cava dei Tirreni with the Blessed Sacrament. The plague miraculously ceased, and even today, each year in the month of June, the people of Cava dei Tirreni organizes several solemn processions in commemoration of the Miracle.
