Your exchange of vows and rings is the central focus of your wedding day, so you'll want to make good choices when you consider the music. And since you are marrying in The Roman Catholic Church, you'll also want to be aware of some guidelines. The music must be sacred (Catholic texts), and while we want the music to be beautiful – such as a traditional solo like *Ave Maria* - we would also like the music to be accessible to family and friends. So include songs that are at least somewhat familiar to your guests, so that they may sing along where possible. And even if they don't sing, they can follow the words in the hymnal if they wish, and make them a prayer for you both. You should meet with me at least two months before the big day.

PARISH AND MUSIC FEES 2021

Your total wedding fees are covered by one \$700 check payable to Saint Peter the Apostle Parish, due at least two weeks before your wedding date.

Of your total \$700 wedding fee to the parish, \$400 compensates both the Director of Music (\$250), and the Cantor (\$150). IRS regulations require the parish to make the proper deductions for this income to our musicians.

Please note that the \$250 Director of Music portion applies to every wedding that takes place at Saint Peter the Apostle, even where you choose not to employ our Director of Music, and decide instead to bring in an organist from outside the parish.

Should you require us to *rehearse* an instrumentalist or soloist from outside the parish, an additional \$75 rehearsal fee payable by check to the parish will apply.
