Brothers and Sisters,

I would like to thank you all for such a warm welcome as your new pastor. My assignment in the Vatican was a wonderful and extraordinary experience, and I am blessed to have had that opportunity. Nevertheless, I have been looking forward to returning to parish life for some time. It is a joy to be here at Christ the King with all of you and I'm looking forward to the years ahead together. The goodness and the faith of the parishioners here are evident. After one week I can see that Christ the King Parish is a place where the Lord is worshipped, children are educated, the sick and homebound are visited, and those in need find help. The way people care about each other and the wider community is beautiful. The new parish center is a tangible sign of the unity of the parish and how this community has flourished under the guidance of Msgr. Paperini. I hope to build upon his good work. Many of you know that I worked for Msgr. Paperini when I served on the faculty of Mount Angel Seminary, and am grateful for the mentoring I received from him. I know how much he will be missed.

I've decided to continue the practice from my previous pastorate of a "Pastor's Column" here in the bulletin. This will afford the opportunity for me to communicate with the parish on various matters and events. This first column is primarily to express my gratitude for the warm welcome, for the help in my installation as pastor last Sunday and for the generosity of many parishioners in helping to outfit the rectory. With Msgr. O'Connor, myself and our seminarian Mr. Brent Durschmidt for the summer, we have a full house.

You have heard me talk about the centrality of our Lord Jesus in the Eucharist, and the importance of being a Eucharistic parish. Vatican II reminded us that the Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life." This means giving Him our best in the Sacred Liturgy. As a former Papal Master of Ceremonies, your new pastor has a great love for the Sacred Liturgy and is committed to promoting a culture of liturgical excellence in our parish according to the mind and heart of the Church. In the coming weeks you will be noticing some slight liturgical adjustments. These are simply building upon the adjustments Msgr. Paperini made with the promulgation of the new Archdiocesan norms on the Eucharist, and to implement our new Archdiocesan Liturgical Handbook, both in letter and in spirit. We are blessed that the Archdiocesan Director of Divine Worship, Msgr. Gerard O'Connor, resides in our parish. He is singular in his rare combination of expertise in liturgy, a Doctorate in Sacred Liturgy from the Pontifical Liturgical Institute in Rome, and of parish experience as a former pastor. If you find any of these adjustments perplexing, please do not hesitate to ask either myself or Msgr. O'Connor. I thank you for your trust, patience and understanding in advance.
