

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends in Christ,

Recently, I attended the memorial Mass of Sister Frances Antoinette Engler, SSJ. She was an eighty-year-old Sister of Saint Joseph who taught theology at Archbishop Ryan High School for over thirty years. Tragically, Sister Frances died two weeks ago when she was hit by a truck while crossing the street near a busy intersection in Northeast Philadelphia.

I had the privilege of working with this wonderful religious sister during my three years as the high school chaplain of Archbishop Ryan. I thought of Sister Frances while reflecting on our first reading for this Sunday from the Book of Joshua. Joshua, who succeeded Moses as the leader of God's chosen people, clearly states the challenges faced by a people tempted to worship the false gods around them: they have to make a choice to either serve the living God, or to worship false idols. With firm faith and conviction, Joshua exclaims: "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord!" (24:2a).

I am reminded of my former colleague, Sister Frances, because in teaching the faith to young people, she made it clear to them that they have to decide how they are going to live their lives. Either they will follow God, or they will subscribe to the false values of the predominant secular culture around us.

In our Gospel from Saint John, which is a continuation of the Bread of Life discourse, many of the disciples could not accept the "hard teaching" of Jesus that He is going to give us His flesh and blood to be our food and drink. Many of them walked away from Jesus and "returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him" (6:66). Then Jesus asked the Twelve if they too would abandon Him. It was Saint Peter, whom Jesus made the Head of the Apostles, who responded in faith: "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life" (6:68).

As disciples of Jesus, we are faced with decisions big and small each day whether we will follow God or follow "the world." In John's Gospel, "the world" is used to mean the unredeemed who do not want to accept Jesus. The Gospel is not meant to be easy. Following Jesus involves the Cross. It is a call to grow in virtue. It is a challenge to be selfless and to reflect to those around us the unconditional and merciful love of God.

When we are confronted with the temptation to abandon the Lord, may the grace we receive in the Holy Eucharist give us the faith to respond like Joshua and like Saint Peter, steadfast in faith with the wisdom to realize that Jesus alone has the words of eternal life.

May God bless you and Mary keep you. Father Shenosky


