

## ~ Prayer to Saint Michael ~

St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle.

Be our defense against the wickedness and snares of the Devil.

May God rebuke him, we humbly pray, and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly hosts, by the power of God, thrust into hell Satan, and all the evil spirits who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.



Dear Friends in Christ,

When I was in high school, a wise teacher once said that it takes eight times of repeating something in order to commit it to memory. I was reminded of this lesson in reflecting on how many times the centrality of the Cross appears in the liturgy this past week. Last Sunday, the Gospel from Saint Mark presented Jesus' first passion prediction (cf. Chapter 8). Then a few days later, on September 14th, the Church celebrated the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. The following day, September 15th, we observed the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows, in which we enter into the mystery of Mary at the foot of the Cross. And this Sunday, the Gospel taken from Saint Mark presents Jesus' second passion prediction (cf. Chapter 9).

The Church reminds us of the Cross of Christ so often because of its centrality in our lives as Christians. For the disciple of Jesus, life is always lived in the shadow of the Cross. In his Letter to the Galatians, Saint Paul expresses how his life has been conformed to the Cross: "I have been crucified with Christ, and the life that I live now is not my own; Christ is living in me. I still live my human life, but it is a life of faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself up for me" (2:20).

The Cross is real, and the Cross is hard. But we do not carry it alone: Christ always helps us to carry our cross. It is through the Cross of Jesus that we have victory over sin and death. For this reason, the Cross is our triumph and our glory.

Saint Andrew of Crete beautifully articulates the importance of the Cross for our salvation: "Had there been no cross, Christ could not have been crucified. Had there been no cross, life itself could not have been nailed to the tree. And if life had not been nailed to it, there would be no streams of immortality pouring from Christ's side, blood and water for the world's cleansing. The legal bond of our sin would not be canceled, we would not have obtained our freedom, we should not have enjoyed the fruit of the tree of life and the gates of paradise would not stand open. Had there been no cross, death would not have been trodden underfoot, nor hell despoiled" (from Oratio 10 in Exaltatione sanctae crucis, as quoted in the Liturgy of the Hours, Volume IV, p. 1390).

Let us glory in the Cross of Our Lord Jesus Christ, who is our hope and our salvation!
