Excerpts from the Lectionary for Mass ©2001, 1998, 1970 CCD

The Sacrament of Holy Baptism

We require that you contact the Church Parish Office before the child is born or shortly after birth and pick up a Holy Baptismal Packet. Once the packet is completed both parents must attend a Baptism Class. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Confirmed Roman Catholic in good standing who regularly attend Sunday Holy Mass.

The Sacrament of Holy Matrimony

Arrangements must be made with the Pastor at least six months in advance. To avoid schedule conflicts, all wedding dates held at Our Lady of the Most Holy Rosary and St. Frances Cabrini Church must be confirmed with the Pastor, who should be the first contact of the couple. Please pick up a wedding guidelines booklet at the Church Parish Office or online for details of paper work and preparation requirements.

The Rite of Holy Christian Burial

Our Roman Catholic Faith teaches the infinite value of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass for the repose of the soul of a departed one. Roman Catholic Church law states that the Mass of Christian burial is properly celebrated in the Church.
(Code of Canon Law: 1177 § 1)

May 31, 2020
Pentecost Sunday

You can feel so small standing by the seashore. The vastness of all that is before you expands much farther than your eye can see. What is happening on the other side? As tides continue to ebb and flow, what occurs as they come and go remains largely a mystery and the effects of their presence unknown in your sight. Yet, things are moving and changing as you gaze upon the water, as the thumbprint of their presence is left behind. The greater the wind and wave, the greater the effect. But even a gentle breeze leaves its humble mark upon the seashore on which you stand. The smallest pebble still makes a ripple in the great blue expanse of ocean waters. It doesn't need to be big.

You never know the full impact of your smallest gesture or simplest of words. A yes or no, agree or disagree, here or there, this or that can influence time and history in ways you may never know. The Holy Spirit is like that: fierce and torrential, and then almost still and silent, creating and recreating nonetheless. Coming as a gentle breeze or a gusty wind, God's Holy Spirit continues to move over, around, and into the waters of our lives. The Spirit brings fruit and unknown possibilities to what we humbly bring with us and that same Spirit eventually brings all to fulfillment in Christ.

The first disciples didn't have much. They possessed simple faith and a willingness to go into uncharted territory with a love of their friend-God, humble offerings, and a knowledge that they were not alone. This allowed them to do amazing things with very little. Do you believe that you are being led and that you have a purposeful life? We often do not realize our value because we do not think that the little we have is good enough. How wrong we are! A little flour mixed with water and embraced by a prayer of blessing transforms simple offerings into the magnificent Eucharistic presence of God. If the Holy Spirit can do such amazing things with these humble gifts of the earth, even more can happen with you. Don't underestimate the value of the smile you gave a stranger, the door held open for an elderly widow, the listening ear offered to one who was lonely, the tolerance given to the wounded soul who is angry, and the loving shoulder you offered as a cradle under the head of someone in pain. Modest gifts offered with love can be transformed by the Spirit into wondrous blessings you may never know. It's Pentecost. Trust. You are not alone.

Why St. Roch is a powerful patron against plagues

The plague disappeared everywhere he went. During the 14th century there was a plague in Italy, and St. Roch came upon one of the towns most affected by it.

According to the Catholic Encyclopedia, he "devoted himself to the plague-stricken, curing them with the sign of the cross. He next visited Cesena and other neighboring cities and then Rome. Everywhere the terrible scourge disappeared before his miraculous power."

He eventually contracted the plague himself, but after retreating to the forest, he was also cured from the disease.

After his death, St. Roch's intercession was invoked when a plague struck Germany in the 15th century.

In 1414, during the Council of Constance, the plague having broken out in that city, the Fathers of the Council ordered public prayers and processions in honor of the saint, and immediately the plague ceased.

Time and time again he was invoked during various medieval plagues and is why he is labeled a patron against plagues.

Prayer Blanket Ministry

The prayer blanket is a crocheted lap-ghan. Prayers are said with every stitch. The colors usually represent the illness. It measures 40' x 52" with an insert of a cross. Example: For bone cancer—the cross would be yellow with a purple background. After the blanket is completed is it folded, wrapped with a ribbon and accompanied by a prayer card. Then brought to be blessed by Fr. Mark. The blanket is usually requested by a friend or family member. It is not sold but a donation to help pay for supplies is appreciated. Once the recipient receives the blanket "PLEASE" unwrap it and use it. My name is Ruby Duhon and I make prayer blankets. My phone number is (337) 652-1337 if you would like to place an order.

How to Use Text Giving

- Text the word GIVE to 13374677797
- If it's your first time, you'll be prompted to click a link directing you to the online giving page to complete a one-time registration. Click "SIGN IN" then click "REGISTER FOR" 1 of the page.
- Complete contact information
- Enter the secure PIN that the system texts you.
- Select the fund, enter the donation amount and payment information before completing your gift.
- Click "SAVE PAYMENT" to keep your payment information securely saved for future gifts.
- To text a donation after the one-time registration, you can give immediately without having to re-enter any of your information.
- Simply text the desired amount and the fund keyword to the text giving number. Ex: 250 tithe for \$250.00 to the Tithe fund.

Other Text Commands

- EDIT** – Make changes to your giving account and update contact information and/or update payment information.
- REFUND** – Refund your last gift. You must text "REFUND" within 15 minutes to refund the gift. If you realized the mistake after 15 minutes, contact the church or organization you are giving to for a refund.
- KEYWORD** – See a list of active keywords. Keywords are the fund names that the church has set up.
