### REGISTRATION FOR THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION

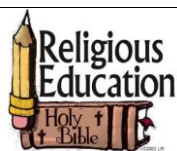

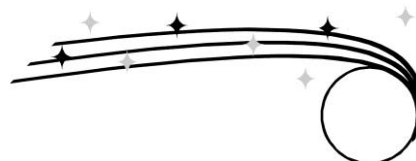

## ST. THERESE YOUTH RETURN FROM SUCCESSFUL DUNLOW TRIP

With much gratitude for the support of our parish's organizations, sponsors and members, 41 members of our parish (including 28 high school teens and 13 adults) returned from a week of service in Dunlow, West Virginia on Saturday evening July 23rd. They made up St. Therese's 4<sup>th</sup> Mission Trip to Appalachia.

We traveled to the tiny Appalachian town in West Virginia with plans to finish building a home for an elderly gentleman, paint the gymnasium in the Dunlow Elementary School, update and refresh the school library which we built and stocked 3 years ago and work with the teachers at Dunlow Elementary to run our 3<sup>rd</sup> Science Camp. Each day began with Mass by Fr. Marc at 6:30 am and team members split into groups to head off to work after breakfast.

The crew assigned to the home building installed doors, leaders and gutters, insulation and drywall for an ebullient gentleman named Larry and had lots of laughs as they worked hard. Larry was as grateful as you might imagine, since this home would replace a condemned trailer in which he lived and would be the first place he had ever lived with indoor plumbing! But our teens got to know Larry and learned that he gives far more than he receives. He generously shares his meager "crops" and deer hunting bounty with his neighbors around him, and was ready to give the little he had to our group, too.

Our team painting the gymnasium and murals in the school's hallway had more fun and laughs than painters typically have! On one morning, they arrived to learn that power in the school was out until the afternoon due to "rolling blackouts" employed by the power company in that area. Despite that inconvenience, they completed the jobs so that the children returning to school next week will be shocked at the happy murals in the hallway and bright colors in the gym which will greet them!

Our Science Camp had its best attendance ever, with over 30 Dunlow elementary-aged children present. Our adults and teens worked with the Dunlow teachers to lead a very successful camp. Children attending received a free breakfast and lunch, and for many this is a draw to their attendance as these may be their only meals of the day. A second group of our teens, led by an adult, refreshed the school library and led a "story-time" segment of the Science Camp. It should be noted that reading scores at Dunlow Elementary are among the highest in Wayne County, having more than doubled since the library was installed 3 years ago!

Finally, our team at the Community Center worked with Bill Likens and the Presbyterian Outreach in Dunlow to staff their monthly food pantry. On Thursday morning and afternoon, 200 families were fed and provided 50 lbs of groceries. Many of our teens and adults got to meet Dunlow residents as they carried boxes of groceries and learned more about these folks, and seven of our team members gave our mission cross away as a gift to their new acquaintance! On Thursday evening, our teens hosted 30 children and teens from Dunlow for a "joint science event" which was led by the Liberty Science Center in Jersey City, NJ via the internet. These young people "stopped by" again on Saturday morning (at 6am!) to say goodbye to our team, and Bill Likens commented that our group "*was the warmest, most interactive group we have ever done this kind of event with!*"
