FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

We are beginning a new Youth Ministry which will be conducted by the Capuchin Youth Ministry program from Garrison. They will be assisted by Wendy Zepf of our parish. The first meeting is today, Sunday, September 30th in the church meeting room following the 5:30 PM Mass.

I am hoping to start a "Building and Grounds Committee" as a subcommittee of the Pastoral Council. This group would advise me on capital improvements and any major repairs that need to be done to any of our parish buildings. Anyone with expertise in these areas who is interested please email the Parish Office.

These days many people pay their bills online. You may know that you can make your donations through a service called We Share. This service eliminates the need to carry cash or checks and transmits your donations electronically. It is also helpful to the parish during the summer months and holidays when many people are away. There is a link on our parish website for We Share. Please consider joining.

I have had our sound system evaluated by Monte Bros. of Ardsley. They have installed most of the sound systems in churches here in the Archdiocese and many beyond New York. Churches are their specialty. Our system is very old, it even has a cassette player in it! It needs to be replaced. The proposal is for \$34,000 which can be paid over time if need be. We do not currently have the funds for this project. If you have any suggestions please let us know.
