FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

At each Sunday Mass we recite the Nicene Creed and at the conclusion of that profession of faith we affirm our belief in the "communion of saints". What we are acknowledging is our faith in the spiritual bond that connects us with all those who've gone before us. This coming week we celebrate All Saints Day and we honor all the men and women who now live in the presence of God in heaven. We honor all those who are canonized and whose names we know, but we also honor all whose names that are known perhaps only to God and us. We honor our family members, our neighbors and all who lived lives of faith and who are now in heaven. On All Souls Day we remember the souls in purgatory who will one day join the saints in eternity. These two days serve as an important reminder to each of us that just as we pray for those who have died, the saints in heaven can intercede for us that one day we will join them in the glory of the Risen Christ.

On a serious note we are experiencing a difficult financial situation here in St. Patrick's. Our weekly donations do not meet our fixed monthly expenses. Those fixed expenses do not include the variable costs of utilities, supplies, fuel etc. I ask that you look at your weekly support and reflect on whether you might be able to increase your weekly donation. I also urge you to consider online giving through "We Share." There is a link to the sign-up page on our parish website. It eliminates the need to carry cash or checks and guarantees your donation even when you are away on a particular Sunday. Thank you for your consideration.
