## *FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:*

As we are now in Ordinary Time, we hear in the Gospel the first of the signs that Jesus performed that inspired people to believe in Him. The scene was the Wedding Feast at Cana when the wine had run out. Rather than going directly to Jesus, the waiters seek Mary's help so the hosts of the feast will be spared any embarrassment. Jesus changes water into wine and all are satisfied. This sign reveals the glory of Christ and it also is the first instance when Mary acts as an intercessor between someone in need and her Son.

This week of January 22, we mark the 46<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the infamous Roe v. Wade decision that legalized abortion in our nation. As you may know there is pending legislation in New York State to even go further than Roe v. Wade. It would allow non-doctors to perform abortions, allow abortions even in the third trimester and remove protections for babies born accidentally alive in the course of an abortion. We pray that one day all will see that every human life, born and unborn, is sacred. Every life deserves to be honored, cherished and protected.
