FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

Dear Parishioners,

On this Palm Sunday, we enter into Holy Week. This is a sacred time when we recall the events in the final days of Jesus' earthly life which in fulfillment of the Father's will accomplished our salvation. The Passion that we hear today gives us a summary of those events. As Our Lord triumphantly enters Jerusalem to the cries of "Hosanna" we know that the cries would soon turn into "Crucify Him." His hour has arrived when He would sacrifice His life for our salvation.

On Holy Thursday we recall the Last Supper when the Lord instituted the priesthood and the Eucharist fulfilling the promise that He would always be with us. As He washes the feet of His Apostles, Jesus reminds us of the call to reach out to others in humble service. Good Friday helps us to recall the passion and death of Jesus who would save us through His life-giving death.

The Easter Vigil and the liturgies of Easter bring the story to its fulfillment. While it is Jesus' story, it is our story as well. It is the story of hope. Death and darkness are not the final gestures of a God who loves us so deeply. Life will always triumph over death and light will always conquer the darkness. May Holy Week and Easter be a time for us to grow in our faith and deepen our hope that the power and promise of the Risen Christ will guide us through all the struggles we experience on this journey of life.

I wish a blessed Holy Week and joy-filled Easter to all our parish families!
