Mine Hear My Voice

Our listening within the heart attunes us to our Beloved. Divine words have a higher frequency than ordinary discourse; they are more subtle and easily overlooked. By listening within the heart, we develop the ear of the heart, the inner listening of the soul that can perceive at this higher frequency. When our Beloved speaks to us, hints to us, then we know we belong to love, and we begin to feel the security of this belonging. Love's response carries the intimacy of this relationship. The Religious Education classes for the school year have finished. Thank you to all the dedicated Catechists and Aides for all their hard work this past year. Have a great summer!

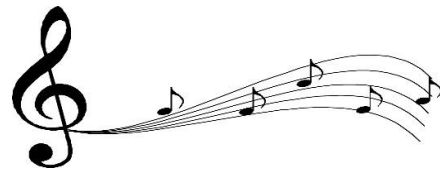
