From the Pastor's Desk:

Dear Parishioners,

As children one of the first things we learned about our faith was how to make the Sign of the Cross. We begin and end every Mass and all our prayers with it. As we enter the Church, we may bless ourselves with Holy Water as we recall the moment when we were baptized into the life of the Blessed Trinity. We may not consciously think of the Trinity as we bless ourselves, but our words and actions signify what we believe. The Trinity, three persons in one God, is a mystery. We often think of a mystery as a novel or a puzzle that clues can help us to solve. In a theological sense, however, a mystery is something we believe but cannot fully comprehend. If we did comprehend, we would be like God. Rather than trying to grasp the mystery of the Trinity let us try to experience the ways that the Trinity is present in our lives. Let us try to imitate the love that binds the three persons in one God together.

We congratulate all in our parish who have graduated from grade school, high school and college this spring. We wish you all the best in the days ahead!

Fr. Luigi Giussani, the founder of the Catholic
movement Communion and Liberation (which
organizes the annual Way of the Cross over
the Brooklyn Bridge and New York Encounter)
was an original and innovative thinker and
educator, able to propose Christianity in a way
that answers the challenges of our time. To
make his thought known to a wider public,

"Giussani Series on Faith and Modernity" to
present a specific aspect of Fr. Giussani's rich
theological and pedagogical
understanding. **The 2019 Giussani Series will
take place on Saturday, June 22, 2019 at

Giussani's proposal for Christian education.
